## School News

Austin, Texas—Consolidation of 1,920 school districts the first year Texas' new education laws were in effect has resulted in larger school units and a better school program, J. W. Edgar, state commissioner of education declared here today.

Consolidations have made possible better building equipment and facilities, teachers giving instruction in fewer subjects and a vastly broadened program of vocational agriculture, trades and industries, and home economic instruction which means better schools for Texas children.

The total number of school districts dropped from 4,412 in 1948-49 to 2,492 operating districts during the last school year. A total of 1,300 of these consolidations were mandatory under new school laws. Six hundred and twenty school districts, however, voluntarily merged with other districts. In addition, the total number of county unit systems (one school system for an entire county) doubled, making the total twenty-four.

"While there has been commendable increases in library, visual aid and laboratory facilities, there has been a tremendous expansion in the vocational departments," Dr. Edgar said.

Vocational departments increased slightly more than 500 during the past year, making a total of 2,087 in the state. With Texas being an agricultural state and gaining rapidly in the world of industry, we on the state level of education certainly encourage our school districts to offer a diversity of courses to train their students to lead Texas in advances in agriculture, home building and trades and industries.

The Commissioners' Court of Donley County, Texas, at the August, 1940, term of said court does now divide said county into election precincts, numbered and described as follows:

PRECINCT NO. 1  
Beginning at a point, the N. W. corner of section 11, Block B-3; thence Easterly along the North line of sections 11 and 8, Block B-3, to the N. E. corner of said section 8; thence Southerly along the East line of section 8 to the N. W. corner of section 62, Block C-3; thence Easterly along the North line of sections 62, 32, 31, 30, 33, 34, 35, 38, Block C-3 and section 4, Block E, to a point in the center of the North line of said section 4, Block E; thence Southerly along the center line of sections 4, Block E and sections 37, 52, 44, 43, 57, 58, 11, and 47, Block C-7 to a point in the center of Salt Fork of Red River; thence Westerly with the meanderings of the center of said river to a point in the East line of League 3, Franklin County School Land; thence Northerly with the East line of League 3 and League 2, Franklin County School Land to the Northeast corner of said League 2; thence Westerly along the North line of League 2 to the S. W. corner.
