School Attendance

The Hedley Schools have had an average of twenty to forty students absent every day since school started in September. Under the Gilmer-Aiken Law a teacher must have 26 students present in each room every day for the 9 months of school.

Last year the school lost one teacher because of parents keeping their children out during school hours. This teacher was saved by getting the Home Economics Department vacationized to 1½ credits. The Superintendent, Vocational Agriculture teacher and Home Economics teacher do not count on the average daily attendance because they are classed under the Gilmer-Aiken Law as special teachers.

Teachers who are lost this year and in the future can not be re-employed. In order that you may have enough teachers in the Hedley Schools to teach your children, you must send your child now in order to help hold all teachers for the benefit of each child.

The school has lost two teachers in two months of school this year and we must ask your cooperation to help your school make progress. However these two teachers can be gotten back providing you send your child to school for the remaining part of the school term.

Now is the time to think about this situation of losing teachers, because after they are lost it is too late to start thinking. The parent by keeping children out of school is going to find departments vacant of teachers, and this is the time the child is going to suffer because of the lack of instruction.

Your child can not and will not be permitted to make his grade if he is not in school. Your cooperation will be appreciated by the Hedley Independent School District.

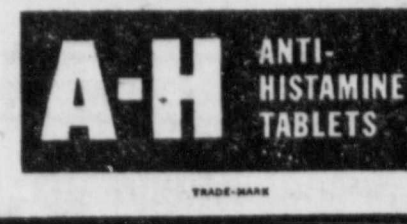

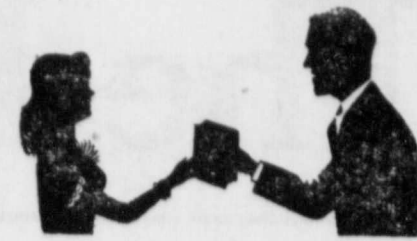

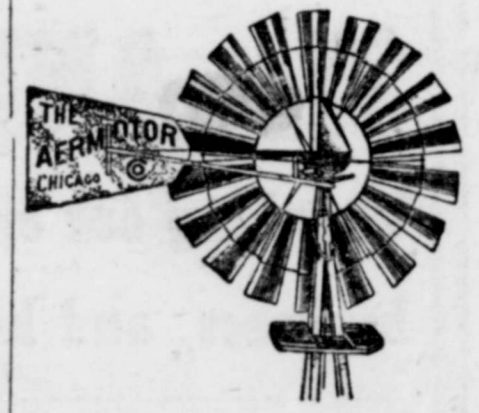
