Glenn Dell Flowers, 21, of Claude and formerly of Hedley, was fatally burned Tuesday morning in an explosion at the Talkington Service Station, 621 Northeast Eighth, in Amarillo. He passed away at 4:30 Tuesday afternoon after having suffered the burns about 10 a'clock that morning.

The cause of the blast was undetermined, but was believed to have resulted from either natural gas or gasoline.

The funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon from the Murphy-Spicer Funeral Home chapel at Clarendon. Burial was in the Clarendon cemetery.

The funeral service was conducted by Rev. W. E. Bond.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Claudel Flowers, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. C. E. Flowers of Claude, five sisters, Mrs. Odessa Mathews of Lelia Lake, Mrs. Loveta Mathews of Quail, Mrs. Ceola Moore of Clarendon, Annie May and Lethia Flowers of Claude, and two brothers, Doice Flowers of Clarendon and Jimmy Flowers of Claude.
