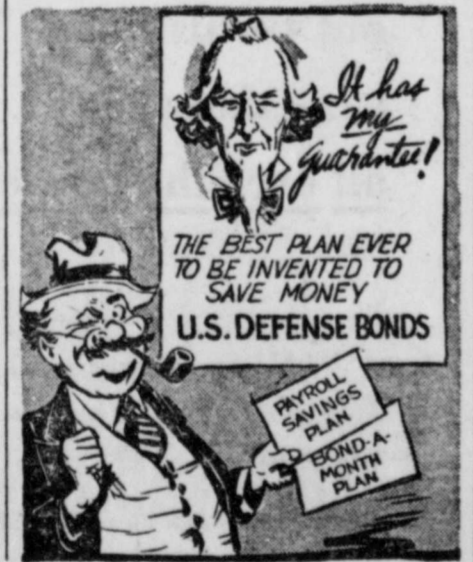

## School Attendance

It is the responsibility of every parent to encourage their children to attend school and get an education for the years to come. The child if properly encouraged at home and at school will be helped to adjust his life to his surroundings.

Some parents have permitted their children to withdraw from school for the simple reason they do not like to go to school. Some children are under sixteen years of age and are attending school less than the required 129 days this year. By the attendance laws of the State of Texas a child must attend school 120 days each year until they reach their 16th birthday.

This law applies to some who are not attending school at the present time. Some children are delinquent on the streets during school hours. Any child who attends school less than the required 120 days will be reported to juvenile authorities at the end of the school term.

## Cotton Leaders Fight Diseases



An educational program to fight diseases of cotton is being conducted in Texas and across the cotton belt by agricultural leaders. The objective of the campaign is to reduce the huge annual losses which cotton farmers suffer because of seed rot, sore-shin or damping-off, angular leaf spot and anthracnose boll rot.

Proper treatment with a seed disinfectant can reduce the effects of all these diseases and the importance of seed treatment is being emphasized by a poster and by educational releases on the subject from the Texas Extension Service. Because of the huge cotton production goal for 1951 and a below average supply of cotton seed, the treatment of seed is particularly important this year.

Texas leaders are shown above examining the poster for the campaign, which is being distributed for display in county agent offices, cotton gins, seed stores and other farm headquarters. 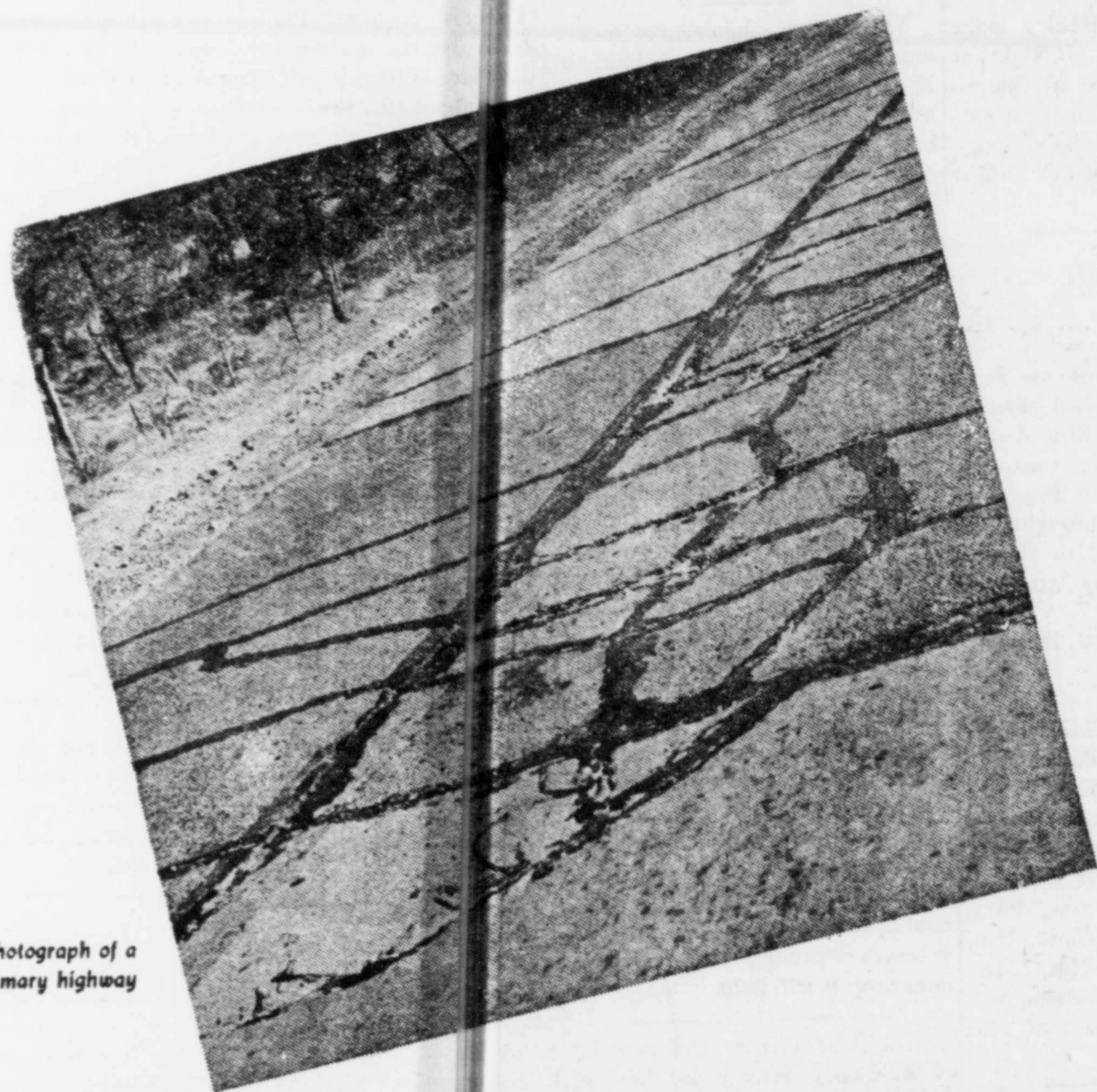

Damaged highways, such as the Texas highway shown in this picture, are a hazard to the safe operation of automobiles, farm trucks and other motor vehicles.

It costs three times as much to build road that will withstand the loads of big trucks now being operated over them than it does for the smaller trucks and automobiles.

Latest records show **\$115,282,344** was spent on Texas highways for the year ending August 31, 1950.

A bill sponsored by the big truck operators is before the Texas Legislature. This bill proposes . . .

- (1) to increase the load limit from the present 48,000 pounds to 72,000 pounds, and
- (2) to increase the maximum truck length from 45 feet to 50 feet.

**TESTED MEAT RECIPES**

**BRAISED SHORT RIBS**  
of Beef with Vegetables

2 lbs. beef short ribs	1/4 onion
Flour	1/4 cup water
2 tablespoons lard	2 carrots
2 teaspoons salt	1/2 green pepper (if desired)
1 teaspoon pepper	2 stalks celery

Cut short ribs into individual squares and brown them. Brown slowly on all sides in lard, allowing 20-30 minutes for browning. Add seasonings, onion (minced), and 1/4 cup water. Cover closely and simmer for 2 hours. Add vegetables, cut small, and continue cooking for 30-40 minutes. Remove meat to platter, thicken the vegetable gravy with 1 tablespoon flour stirred into 1/4 cup water. Serves 4 or 5.

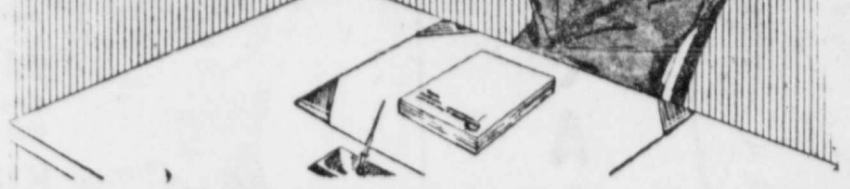
