## Farm-to-Market Road

In Donley County a farm-to-market road from State 203 in Hedley Northwest and North to road intersection, a distance of approximately 5.3 miles, is hereby designated subject to the availability of funds in the Farm-to-Market Road Fund of the State Highway Department as established by Senate Bill 287, Acts 1949, 51st Legislature and appropriated by House Bill 426, Acts 1951, 52nd Legislature, for the improvement of farm-to-market roads by the biennium from September 1, 1951 to August 31, 1953, and subject to the further condition that Donley County will furnish all required right-of-way free of cost to the State.

Upon acceptance of the provisions of this Order by the proper officials of Donley County the State Highway Engineer is directed to proceed with the preparation of plans for construction and when right-of-way and funds are available to proceed with construction and to assume the road for maintenance upon completion of construction.

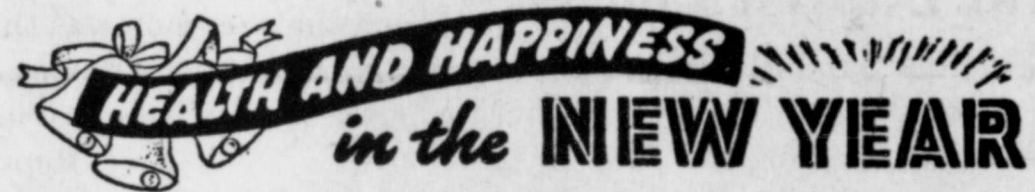
