Several Changes In Security State Bank

The annual stockholders meeting of the Security State Bank was held Tuesday of this week. Officers elected were A. D. Jenkins, President; F. A. Finch, Vice President; and C. L. The bank had a very successful year. After paying the dividends to the stockholders and bonus to the employees they were able to add a substantial amount to their undivided profits account. The bank now shows \$35,000.00 capital, \$35,000.00 surplus, and undivided profits and reserves \$22,086.44, making a total capital structure of \$92,086.44, ample to take care of the needs of the community under all conditions.

Mr. Noel came to the bank here as cashier July 1, 1919 from the First National Bank at Memphis. He became vice president in 1925 and became president upon the death of J. G. McDougal.

Mr. Jenkins comes to Hedley from Troup, where he was executive vice president of the First National Bank. He hopes to move his family here within the next few months. He and Mrs. Jenkins are members of the Baptist Church.

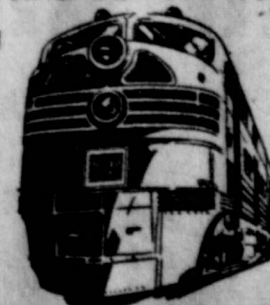
