NO. 11 UNDERWRITERS KNOT

When you repair an electrical plug, pare off half-inch of insulation from each wire. Twist strands tightly and thread wires back through plug. Then tie the safe Underwriters' knot, as shown above, just above exposed part of wires. Turn exposed wires counter clock-wise on posts and tighten down screws firmly.

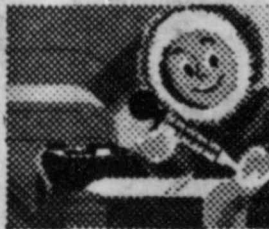

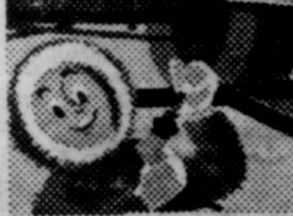

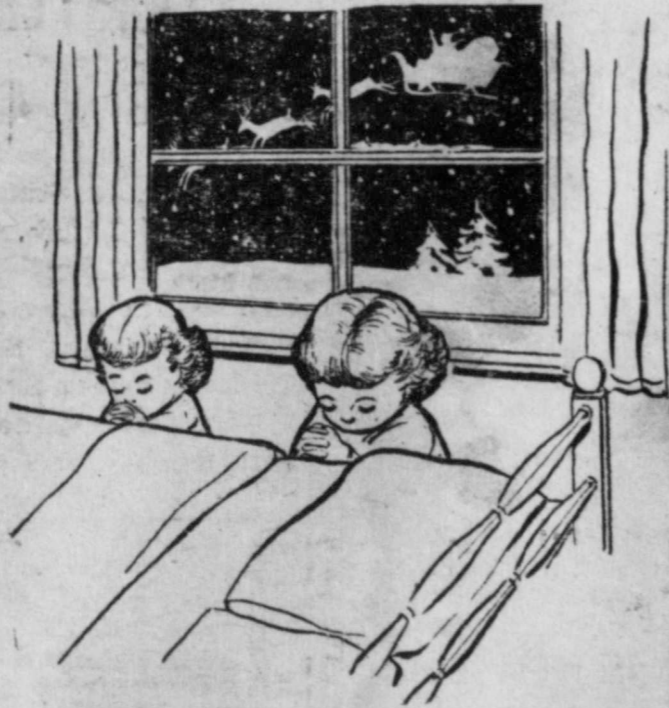
