

Attending the bride as matron of honor was Mrs. H. E. Perry, and Mr. H. E. Perry attended the groom as best man.


Both the bride and groom attended school at Hedley. AM 3-c Allee enlisted in the Navy Dec. 14, 1942.

Guests at the wedding were Miss Claudine Allee of Adrian and Miss Ila Faye Tipton of Hedley.




