Her first stop was in Bangkok, Siam, then she flew to Hongkong, China, where she spent several days sight seeing and shopping. In Hongkong she bought Christmas gifts for every member of her family. This was the first Christmas she had spent with her family in six years.

After spending one day in Tokyo her next stop was in Honolulu where she spent ten days visiting friends and sightseeing. She likes Honolulu so well that she has a dream of settling there after she finishes her present contract with ARAMCO. Then she spent five days visiting in the homes of her uncles and aunts, Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Adamson and Mr. and Mrs. Roger Douthit of Los Angeles, Calif., before reaching home.

On her return trip to Arabia Miss Adamson will stop over in Kansas City, Chicago and New York. She will touch Newfoundland, Shanon, Ireland, Paris, France, Rome, Italy, Athens, Greece, Cairo, Egypt, and finally back to Dhahran, Saudi, Arabia, thus completing a circle around the world.

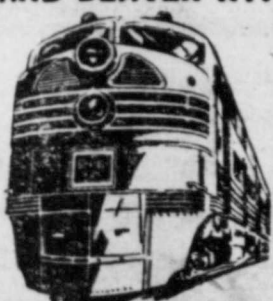

1. Equip your bike with a white light on the front and a red reflector on the rear.

2. Do not ride double or swerve around moving traffic

3. Check your clearance before leaving sidewalk and then look behind you for oncoming traffic.

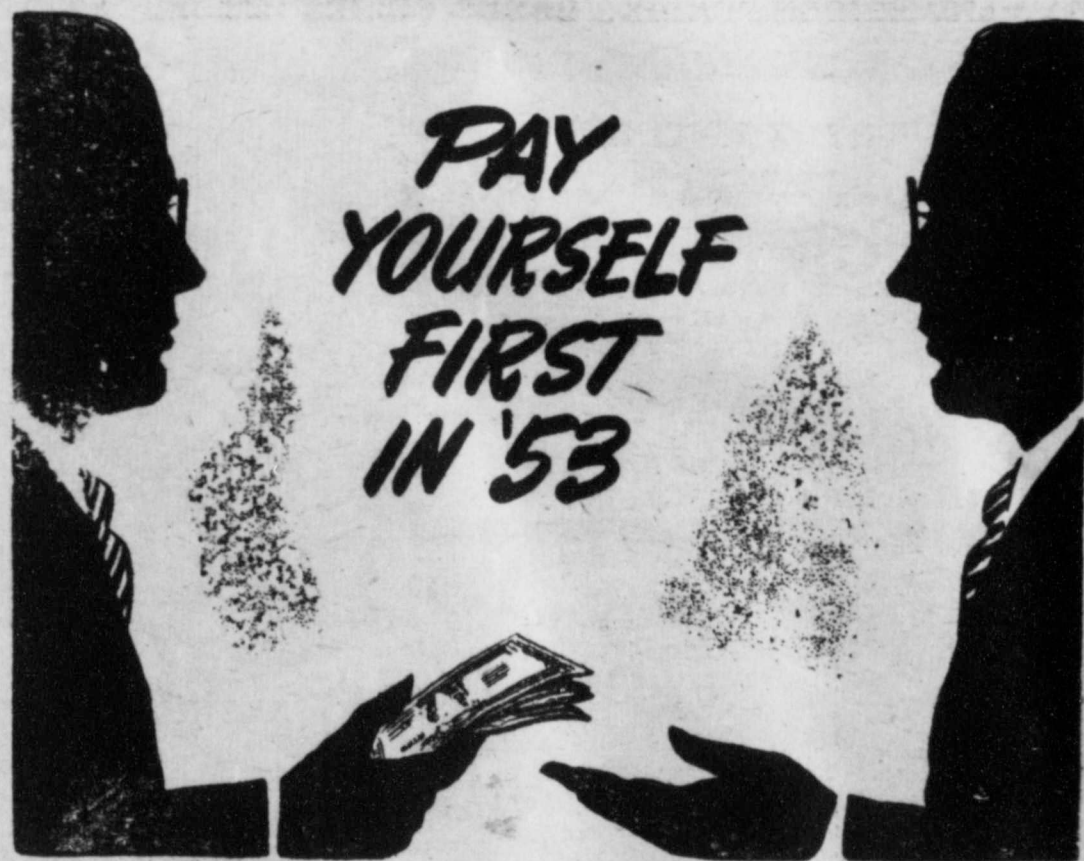

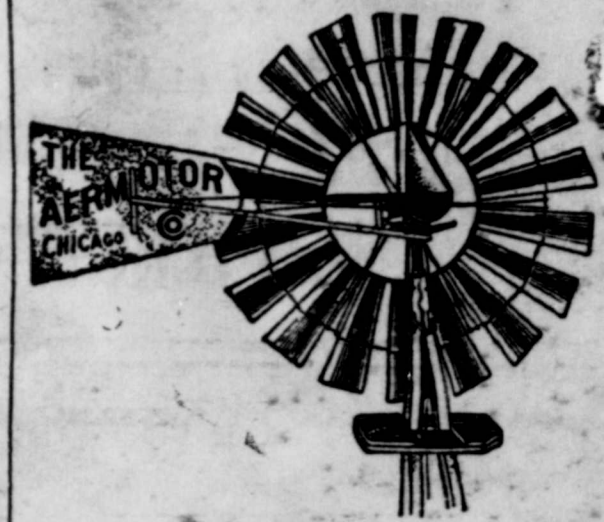

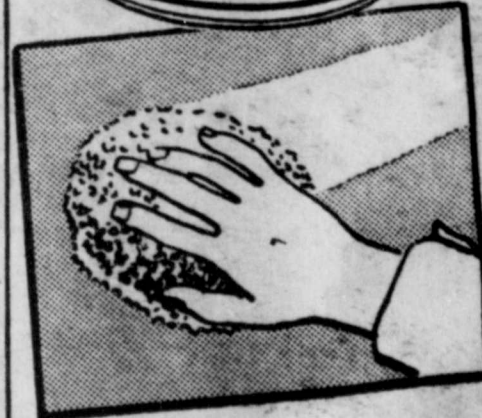
