The team came out 5th in the entire judging with Jack Quisenberry high point man on the Hedley team. There were 56 schools that participated in the contest.

Farm Bureau Backs 4-H and FFA Clubs

The Donley County Farm Bureau is backing 4-H and FFA club work in Donley County. The Bureau paid for two rooms for both the above organizations for one week at the Amarillo Fat Stock Show. This saved the club boys a total of \$78. The two rooms had three double beds in them and then a roll-away bed, in fact about ten boys slept in each room. H. Wood, president of the Donley County Farm Bureau, said the board of directors voted to the last man to do this for the boys and to show them that their organization was very much interested in the young people of the county and their work in club organizations. Doyle Messer, Hedley vocational teacher, Tom Seay, Clarendon vocational teacher, and H. M. Breedlove, county agent, wish to join with all the 4-H and FFA boys from over the county to thank the local Farm Bureau organization for this wonderful gift to the club boys. It surely did help out, and especially at this time with the low price of livestock.

The Hedley FFA boys were well pleased with their placings and prices they received for their animals at the Amarillo Fat Stock Show last week.

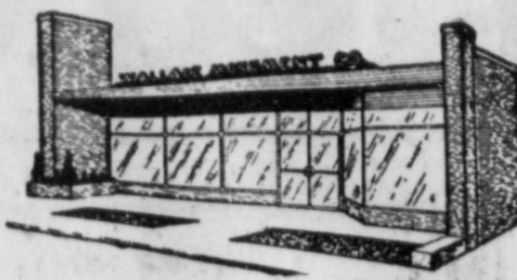

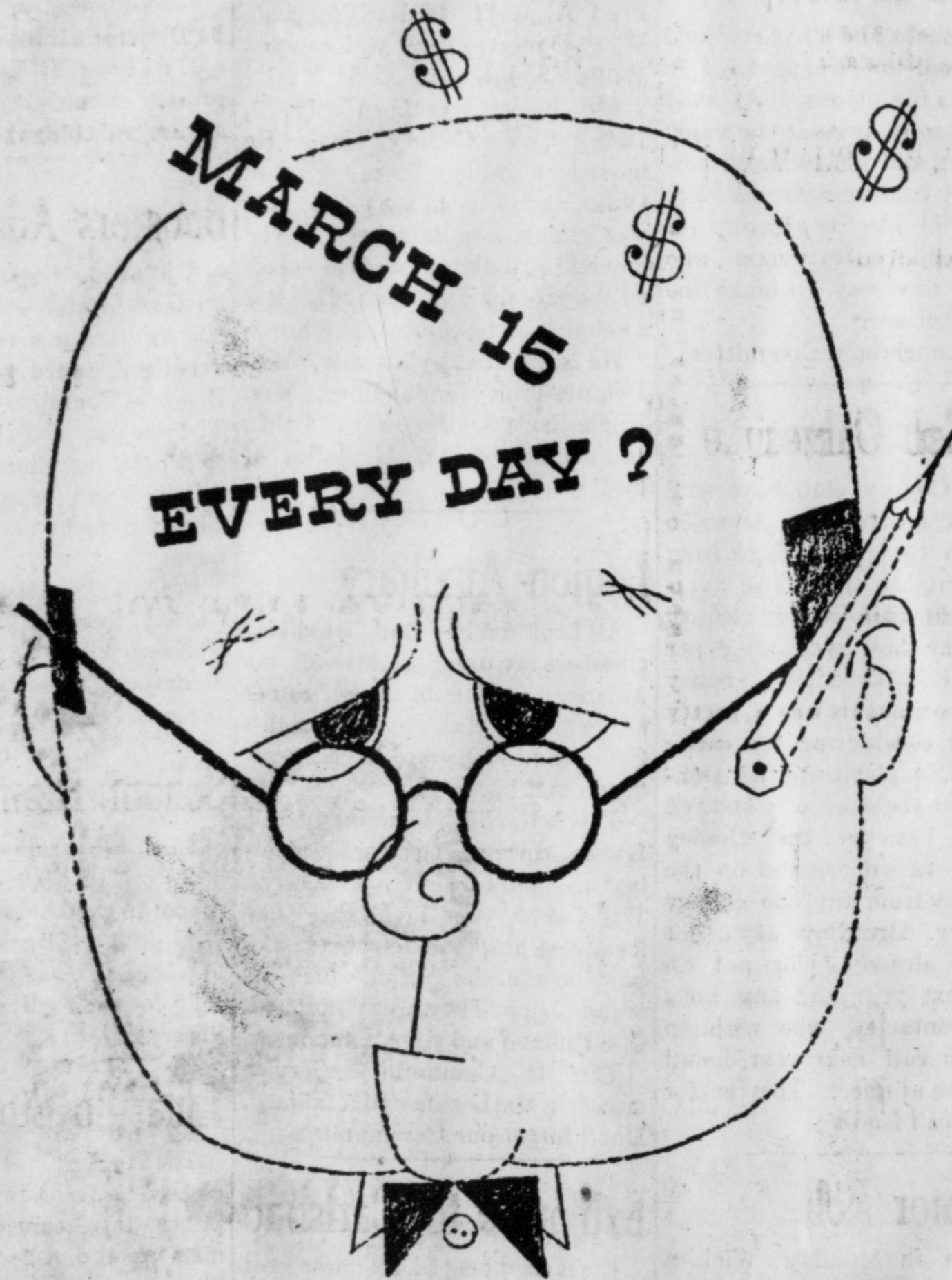

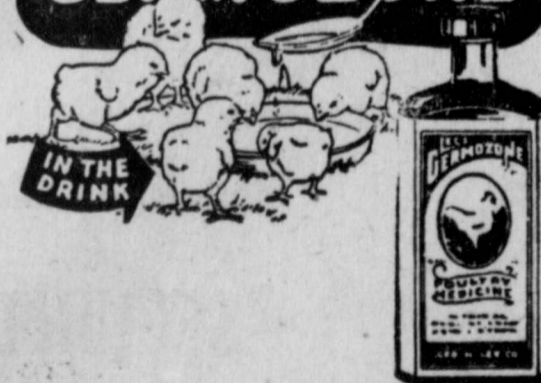
