Notice is hereby given, to whom concerned, that W. R. Christal, the postoffice address of whom is Lelia Lake, Texas, on the 30th day of March, 1953, filed his application in the office of the Board of Water Engineers for the State of Texas, in which he applies for a permit to appropriate of the unappropriated waters of the State of Texas, from Lake Creek, a tributary of the Salt Fork of Red River, in Donley County, Texas, not to exceed 160 acre-feet of water per annum, for the irrigation of not to exceed 155.4 acres of land out of Section 65, Block C-6, G. C. & S. F. Ry. Co Survey, Donley County, Texas, which land is more fully described in said application; water to be diverted by means of a portable pump. The proposed pump sites are located at points which bear (1) North 81° West 2,470 feet, (2) North 46° 40' West, 2,060 feet and (3) North 12° 20' West 1,405 feet from the Southeast corner of Section 65, Block C-6, G. C. & S. F. Ry. Co. Survey, on the East bank of Lake Creek, in Donley County, Texas, and is distant in a Southeasterly direction from Clarendon, Texas, about eight (8) miles.

City Ordinance

An Ordinance of the City of Hedley, Texas, regulating the parking and the movement of vehicles on certain streets in the City of Hedley, Texas, prescribing penalty for violation of the ordinance and declaring an emergency.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Hedley:

Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or drive any vehicle at a greater rate of speed than 20 miles per hour on Main Street of the City of Hedley, Texas, between the North end of Main Street where State Highway 203 enters Main Street and the in-

tersection of Main Street with Highway 287.

Section 2: It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or drive any vehicle at a greater rate of speed than 20 miles per hour on Highway 287 within the Corporate limits of the City of Hedley.

Section 3: It shall be unlawful for any person to park or stop any vehicle behind a vehicle stopped or parked at the curb on Main Street in the City of Hedley, Texas, between the point where Highway 203 enters Main Street and the point where the North line of Highway 287 intersects said Main Street.

Section 4: It shall be unlawful to park or leave standing any character of vehicle within ten feet of any fire plug in any part of the City of Hedley, Texas.

Section 5: It shall be unlawful for any person to load or unload any merchandise, produce or other material from any vehicle on Main Street in the City of Hedley, Texas, between the point on said Main Street where Highway 203 enters Main Street from the North and the point where said Main Street intersects Highway 287.

Section 6: It shall be unlawful for any owner, operator or person in charge of a vehicle transporting gasoline, butane, propane or other similar gaseous volatiles to leave said vehicle standing or parked on Main Street in the City of Hedley, Texas, between the North end of Main Street at a point where Highway 203 enters into Main Street and the point where said Main Street intersects Highway 287.

Section 7: Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined in any sum not exceeding \$100.00.

Section 8: The City Council of the City of Hedley, hereby declares that if any Section, Paragraph, Sentence, Clause, or Phrase of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction, that it would have passed any and all of the remaining portions of this ordinance without the inclusion of that part thereof which may be so found to be unconstitutional, and declares that its intent is to make no part of this ordinance dependent upon the validity of any other part hereof.

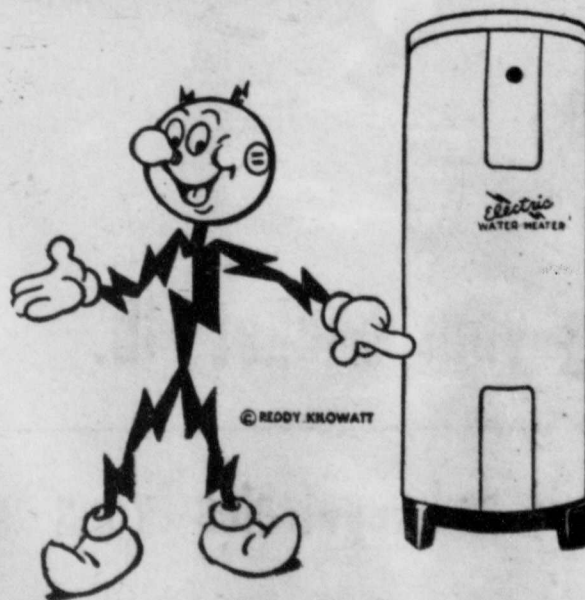
