Time to Poison Hoppers

Now is the time to poison grasshoppers, according to County Agent H. M. Breedlove. The small hoppers are in the hatch area now and are feeding on green grass. They are easier to poison now says the county agent because they are concentrated in the smaller areas where they hatch. Two ounces of concentrated aldrin in enough water to cover one acre is a good poison and also toxaphene at the rate of one pound and a half per acre in enough water to cover the area is a good poison. Breedlove says that either one of these poisons will give good results if used at this time and will prevent the spread of the hoppers after they become older and begin to migrate over the fields.

The county agent urges that you poison now and not wait until the foliage dries up and you have to use wet bait mixtures because the spray mentioned above on green foliage is much more effective.

Anyone wishing additional information should call by the county agent's office and he will be glad to help you work out a spray schedule and types of sprays for the areas.

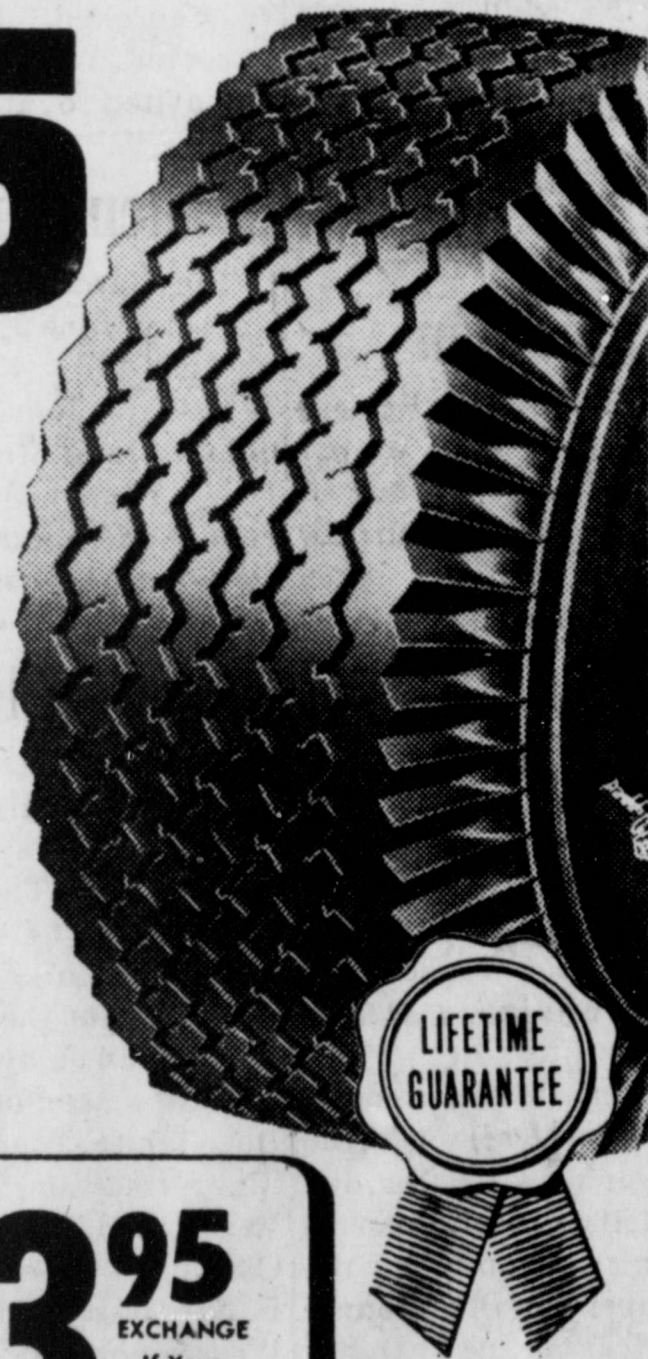
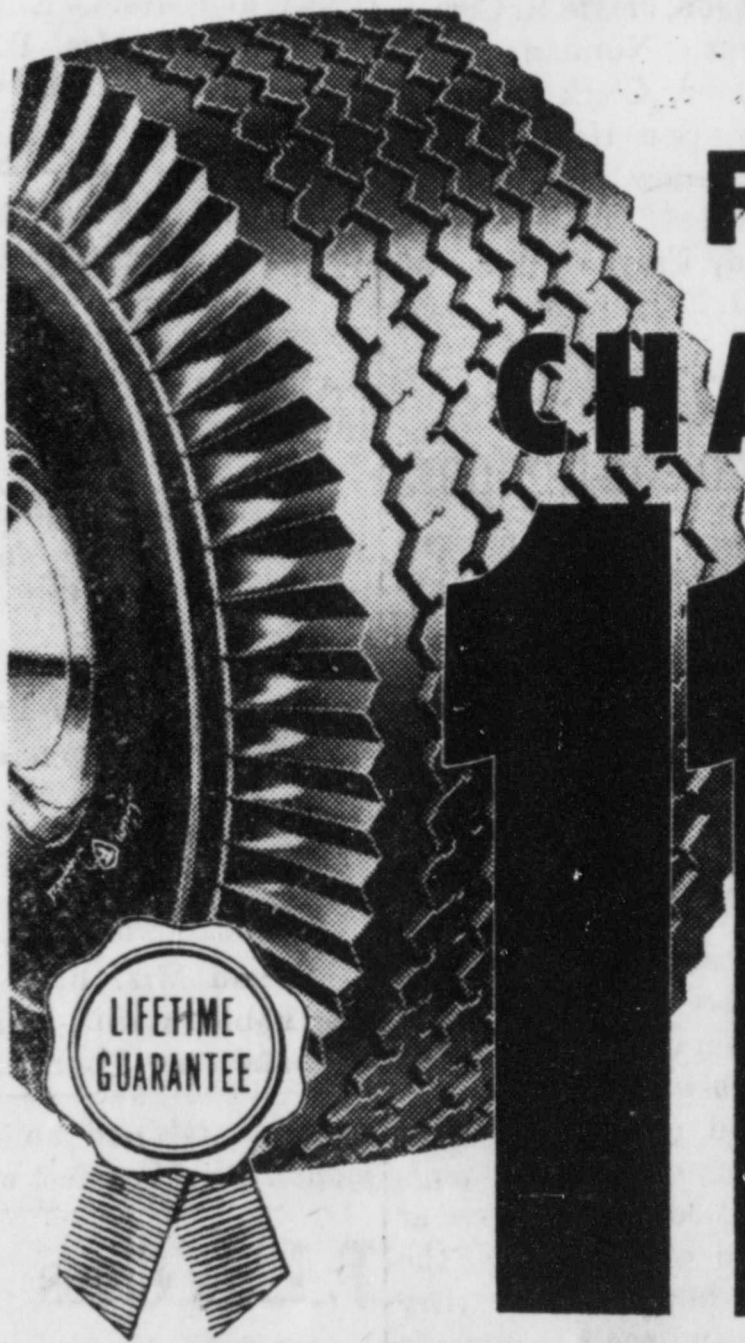

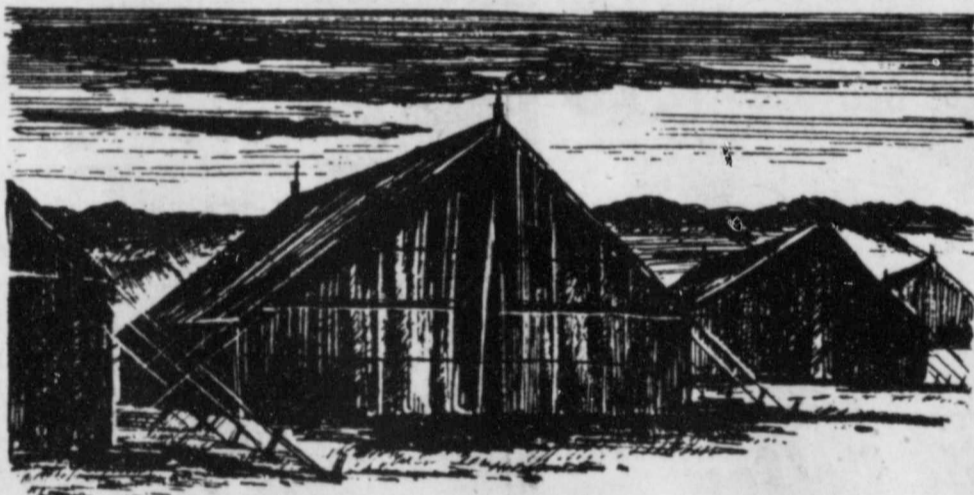
