Big Fire at Memphis

Memphis had probably the biggest fire in its history Saturday when flames destroyed the Monzingo Studebaker Agency, Lemons Funiture Store, Baldwin Variety low. and Durham Drug, and damaged the First National Bank, in a blaze visible many miles away.

Fire trucks from Childress, Estelline, Wellington, Hedley and Clarendon rushed to the scene, although the Hedley truck was not used on account of insufficient water for so many trucks.

Damage was estimated around \$500,000. Origin of the fire has not been determined.


