Hedley's oldest living settler, William Isaac Rains, died suddenly Saturday afternoon at his home west of town.

Funeral services were conducted Sunday from the First Baptist Church by Rev. Walter Patterson of Waurika, Okla., Rev. O. L. Jones and Rev. W. M. Culwell. Burial was in Rowe cemetery under direction of Murphy-Spicer Funeral Home.

He was united in marriage to Miss Willie C. Crawford Feb. 29, 1898, at Giles. They celebrated their golden wedding anniversary Feb. 29, 1948. He had been a member of the Baptist Church since early boyhood.

Mrs. Rains, together with Mrs. Josie Adamson, founded the Donley County Old Settlers Picnic, and Mr. Rains served for many years as president of the organization.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Rains; one daughter, Mrs. Clyde Bridges of Hedley; two sons, Ike Rains of Hedley and Charles Rains of Amarillo; three grandchildren, Mrs. Banks Jeffreys, Bill Bridges and Mrs. Johnnie Everett of Amarillo; and three great-grandchildren, Beverly and Carol Lynn Jeffreys and Charlotte Faye Everett of Amarillo.

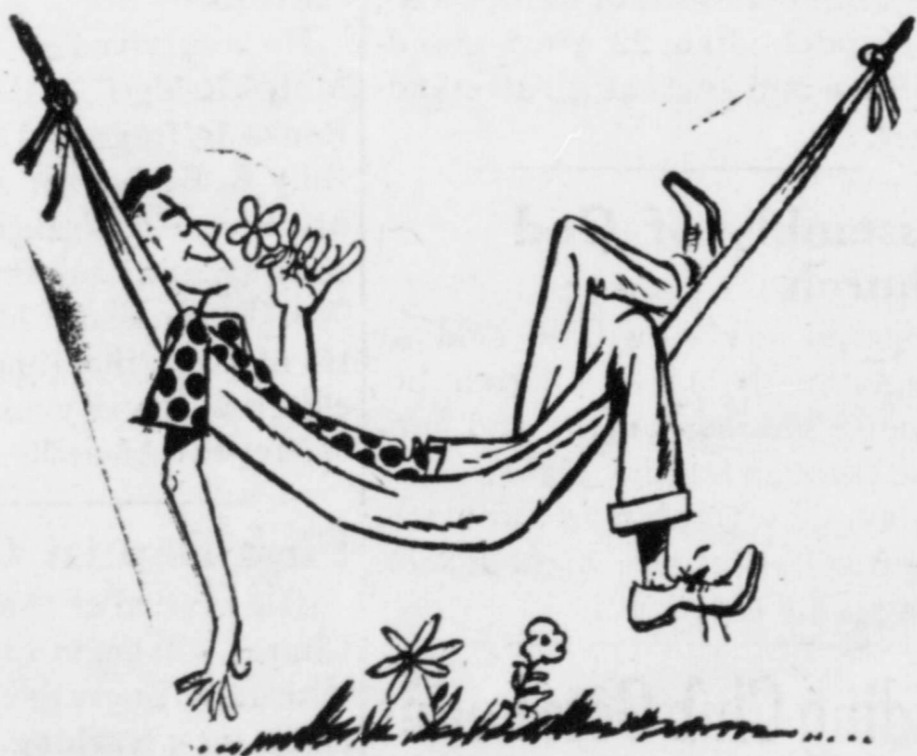
