Meet To Discuss Dam On Salt Fork

A number of citizens from towns in this area met Tuesday night at the Lions Den here to discuss the possibility of a dam on Salt Fork at about the Bray crossing location. Water from the lake formed would be used for municipal supply for several towns, irrigation recreation and possibly other purposes. C. B. Morris of Clarendon presided.

It was voted to get A. H. Woolvertoon, consulting engineer who has made preliminary surveys on the project, to come to a meeting at Wellington around Aug. 10 to further explain the possibilities of the project. A delegation of local citizens is expected to attend this meeting.

The host took the lead in the second inning by a walk, a single to left field, another walk and another hit by Pilcher, the Clarendon pitcher, bringing in three runs. They scored again in the third by an error on the second baseman and a hit to right field by Don Loyd, which left Hedley playing catch-up until the fifth inning when

Hedley pounded the Clarendon pitcher for five hits and five runs scored. The Hedley nine again pounded the Clarendon pitcher for four hits and four runs in the seventh inning. The Clarendon team did not score again until the bottom of the ninth from an error on the shortstop and a sharp double by Don Loyd to centerfield. The pitcher for Hedley was Bobby Hutchinson who threw a bang-up good ball game in spite of trouble in the second and third inning.

The totals for the game are: Hedley, 9 runs, 13 hits, and three errors; Clarendon, 5 runs, 6 hits, and one error. This leaves a three way tie for first place between Hedley, Clarendon and Groom, since Groom lost their game Sunday to AAFB.
