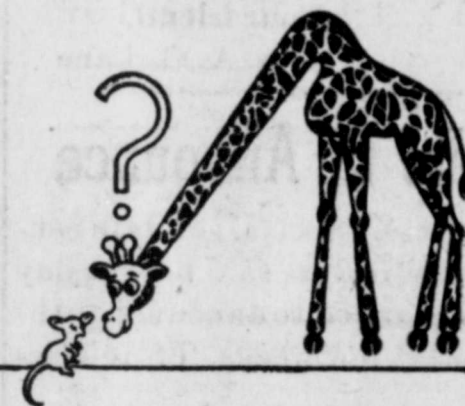

Salt Fork Dam News

The annual meeting of the "Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Association," formerly the "Upper Basin of the Salt Fork and Red River Association" was held at the Lions Den in Hedley Wednesday night.

C. B. (Cap) Morris of Clarendon was re-elected President of the association and Clifford Johnson of Hedley was elected Secretary-Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Directors elected from Clarendon were C. B. Morris, J. R. Porter, and Carrol Knorpp; from Hedley Clifford Johnson; from Memphis Clifford Farmer, M. O. Goodpasture, J. W. Coppedge and T. W. Harrison; from Wellington Bura Handley, Orval Couch, Dan Henard and Jimmie Lee.

Two bonding companies have submitted propositions to the association in regard to building the dam on Salt Fork of Red River north of Hedley. The engineers have located the site of the dam and a permit has been issued by the State Board. The steering committee of the association, which consists of representatives of the seven cities interested will meet soon and pass on the propositions.

News From Our County Agent

H. M. Breedlove, county agent for Donley County, says that in 1954 many farmers and ranchers will be thinking about the crops they will plant on the acreage diverted from cotton due to cotton acreage control. For many farms larger feed reserves are needed, for others a rotation which includes more adapted legumes and grasses can help to maintain productivity. The individual operators should select the program best suited to their farms. Breedlove lists the following suggestions that might help in the use of diverted acreage:

1. Use more silage and hay crops.
2. More use of supplemental grazing crops, such as oats, barley, rye, and sudan.
3. More use of legumes for soil building and grazing.
4. Use of adapted legumes and perennial grasses in long time rotation plan.
5. Grass seed production, especially native species.
6. Establish permanent cover on severely eroded unproductive land
7. Fallow more land where this practice can be used.
8. Increase more commercial fruit production where adapted.
9. Increase acreage in grain crops other than wheat.

The above are merely suggestions says the county agent, and farmers and ranchers are urged to talk over the ideas of crops with Breedlove if there is doubt in their minds as to crops to plant on the diverted acres on the farm.

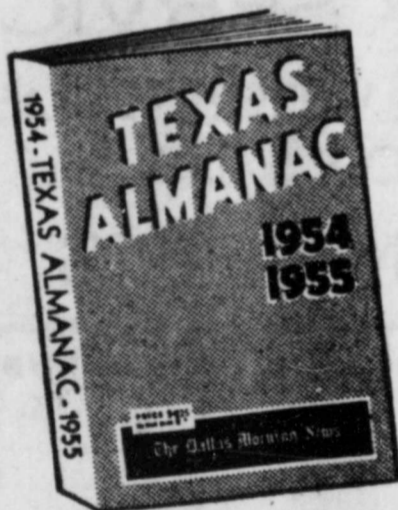



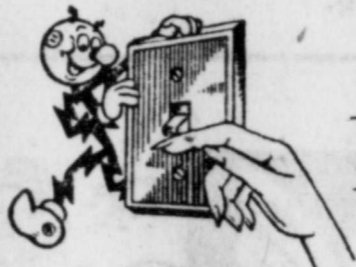
