Donley County Fat Stock Show Feb. 18

The 4-H Club and FFA boys of the county will exhibit their fat calves and sheep at the Donley Co. Fat Stock Show Feb. 18 in Clarendon. Registered breeders from Donley and near by counties will also exhibit breeding cattle at the show. All stock will be in the barns by 9:00 o'clock in the morning and remain in place until 4:00 o'clock in the afternoon at which time they will leave for the Amarillo show.

The premium money was donated by business firms and individuals from Donley county. In the steer division there will be two classes with three prizes in one class and four in the other; the prize money is \$25.00 first, \$15.00 second, and \$8.00 third; the other steer division is \$25.00 first, \$15.00 second; \$8.00 third and \$5.00 fourth. The prize of \$25.00 for the grand champion will be donated by the Clarendon Lions Club, the reserve champion will receive \$12.50. A prize of \$5.00 for the best showmanship will be given by the Thomas Feed Store of Clarendon. The American Legion is buying one of the smaller steers at the local show at 30¢ per pound and will have a barbecue in the spring of good club beef.

In the sheep division there will be ten places with first prize of \$6.50, \$4.00, \$3.00, and all the rest in this class at \$2.00 each. The grand champion lamb will bring \$6.50 in premium and the reserve champion \$4.00.

The judge of the show will be J. P. Smith of Pantex Experiment Farms. Twelve bales of bedding for the calves was donated by Frank Hommel of Clarendon.

Motorists Warned

Captain J. W. Blackwell, commanding officer of District 5 of the Texas Highway Patrol, with headquarters at Amarillo, announced today that Highway Patrolmen would begin issuing tickets to persons who operate an auto on the streets and highways after April 15 without a current inspection sticker. He also pointed out that local and county police officers are empowered to enforce the inspection law.

According to the Patrol commander, only about 20 per cent of the cars in the Donley County area have been inspected to date. This means that car owners who have not yet had their vehicles checked will run the risk of being caught in a last minute "log jam" at the inspection stations if they delay longer in complying with the law.

"Our patrolmen will continue to issue warnings to motorists whose cars do not bear a current inspection sticker through April 15; Capt. Blackwell stated. "After that date, offenders will face court action."

Hedley Boy To Be In Navy Maneuvers

A formidable Task Group 12 comprising 13,000 men and more than 40 ships from the Long Beach and San Diego areas will participate in Pacific Fleet training maneuvers off the West Coast Feb. 15 through Feb. 27.

In over-all tactical command of the armada will be Rear Adm. Maurice E. Gurtis, USN, commander cruiser-destroyer force.

Altogether, mine and amphibious warfare vessels, destroyers, cruisers, aircraft carriers and supporting auxiliaries will take part in the exercises.

Vice-Adm. William K. Phillips, USN, commander, First Fleet, will schedule and conduct the operation from his flagship, the USS Bremerton, for the first week. During the second week he will move to the light cruiser USS Manchester.

The entire task force will put in to San Francisco Feb. 20 to 23 for rest and recreation and to observe Washington's birthday.

Lynn Cherry, one of our home town boys, is aboard the USS Manchester, one of the ships taking part in these maneuvers mentioned above. This ship has been his home for over 3 years, most of the time being spent overseas in the battle zone. Lynn just recently received his good conduct medal which denotes zeal, fidelity, and obedience. He will return home in May having completed 4 years with the US Navy, and plans to resume work with the Santa Fe Railroad in Amarillo where he was employed before entering the service.
