## School and City Elections Very Quiet

With no opposition in either election, the school and city elections aroused very little interest.

Only 13 votes were cast in the school election Saturday, when L. D. Moore and Roy McKee were chosen as trustees.

In the city election Tuesday, 28 votes were polled. C. H. Reid was re-elected mayor, Ansil Adamson and J. F. Mann were elected as aldermen for two years, and Lee Moore for one year.

## News From Our County Agent

Farmers and ranchers have already begun to inquire at the office of county agent H. M. Breedlove in regard to crops for silage this fall. The county agent says that some of the best crops to plant this spring for silage are Atlas Sargo, cane, honey drip cane, corn or almost any heavy producing sweet sorghum. The shortage of feed this year has prompted the trench silo for this fall, and the county agent says that now is the time to pick out that spot on the farm for acreage for the crop to be put in silage this fall. Farmers and ranchers who had trench silos this past winter praise the trench silo and say it was the means to them keeping a much larger bunch of cattle than they could have handled if they had not had the silo. Specifications for digging the silo and the amounts they will hold can be gotten by contacting the county agent. You can plan your acreage for the trench silo according to the number of cattle you have, and have that feed for this winter.

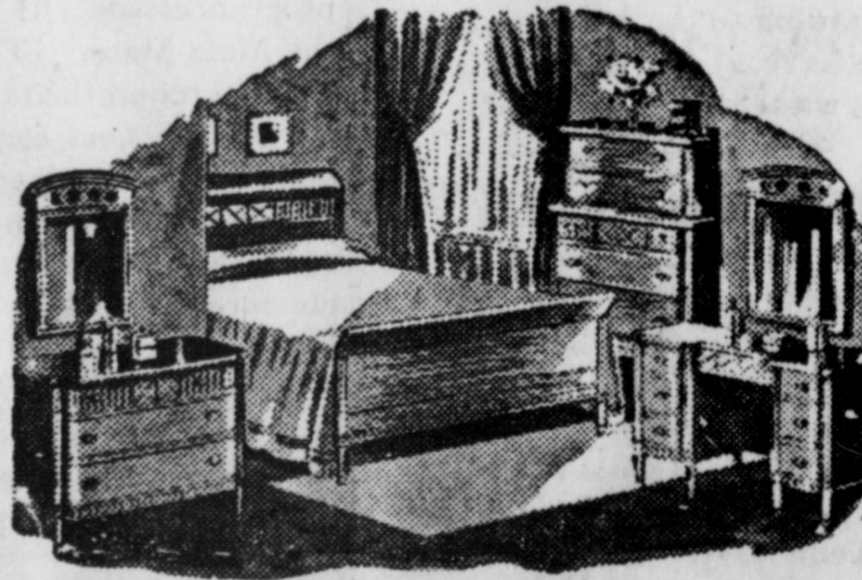

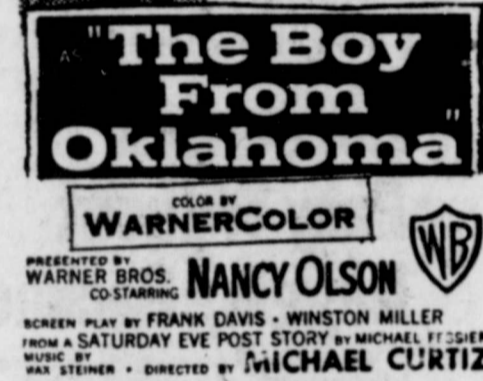

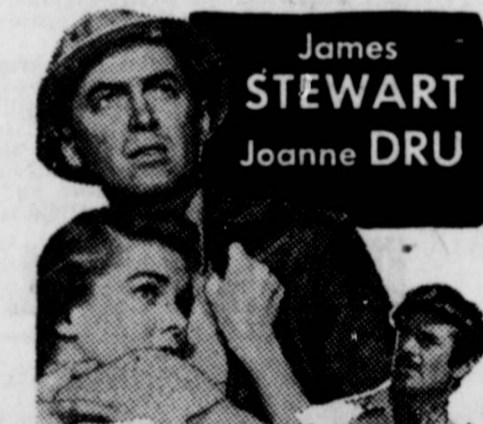
