Salt Fork Dam News

Bonding company attorneys believe the legislative act creating the Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Association is exactly what is needed for the operation of the project. The next step is an election confirming the action of the Legislature.

This election is being held up until the survey of the water users of the territory has been completed. There are indications now that there are several big water users planning to come into this territory that will almost double the present water consumption.

Getting this bill enacted at the special session instead of having to wait until regular session puts our project one full year ahead of schedule. With the cooperation of the citizens of the territory and considering drought conditions in the past this could mean that our dam will be built much sooner than we first expected.

"Air Force" Aids Theatre Promotion

In one of the most unusual Theatre promotions ever used in Texas the Hedley Theatre combined suspense, sidewalk stencils and a one man "airforce" in last week's promotion of "Miss Sadie Thompson." Theatre owner, Bob Harris utilized the visit of his brother-in-law John Bavousett from Clint, Texas in the campaign.

Bavousett piloted his Cessna plane over all towns within 30 miles of Hedley and over 7500 circulars were dropped advertising the Hedley performance. 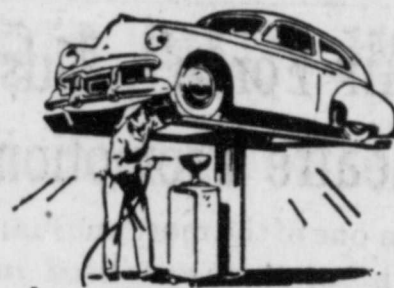

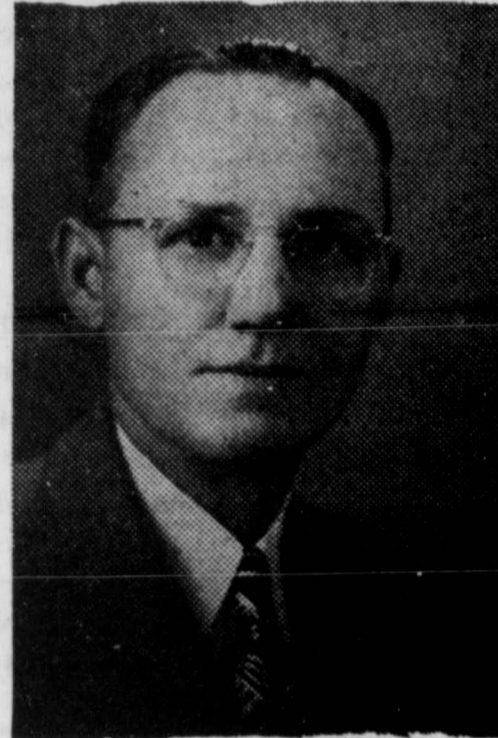
