Hedley Schools To Open August 23rd

The Board of Trustees has set the date to open the 1954-55 school session on Aug. 23, 1954. The faculty is complete except for a band instructor and are as follows: 1st Grade, Mrs. Naomi Gilbreth 2nd, Miss Myrtle Hall 3rd and 4th, Mrs. J. S. Hinds 5th, Miss Elvaree Moore 6th, Miss Moore and band instructor 7th, band instructor 8th and elementary principal, Mr. J. M. Baker

High school teachers are: English, Mrs. Doyle Messer Agriculture, Doyle Messer Social studies, H. E. Martin Commercial studies, Mrs. Martin Home making, Mrs. Ben Wilson Supt., J. S. Hinds

An extra teacher paid for by the state and to work in Hedley and Lelia Lake is Miss Thelma Moss, teacher of public school music.

Mrs. Barbara Truitt will work as a special counselor with the schools of the county.

All beginning students six years of age must be vaccinated for smallpox and have a birth certificate before enrolling.

It was stated in a rather indefinite way in a daily paper that the Hedley and Lelia Lake schools were advised of violations of standards. The following is quoted from the letter this school received from the Accreditation Committee at Austin:

"Hedley, Donley Co.—When this school was visited it was not in session because of a harvest intermission. It is recommended that the school be advised however that the library is not adequate and facilities for teaching natural science are not adequate and the toilet facilities for the elementary school are not entirely adequate."

"Lelia Lake, Donley Co.—It is recommended that this school be advised that the school building needs repairs and paint, there is not enough artificial light, the facilities for teaching natural science are not adequate and the library should be reorganized and improved."

These reports were made last fall. The Hedley school library received \$500 worth of new books year before last, \$500 worth last year, and will get another \$500 worth this year. The library has

Highway 366

It appears that new U. S. Highway 366 will soon be a reality. The highway will run from Ft. Smith, Ark. across Oklahoma to its junction with Highway 287 at Hedley. Work on the east of the highway is supposed to be completed in August and the highway taken into the U. S. System and under U. S. numbers by Sept. 1st

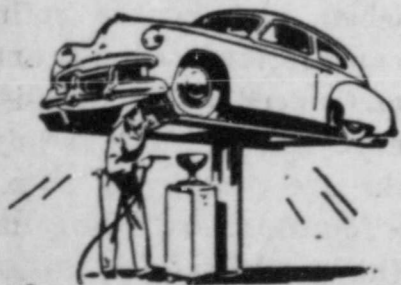

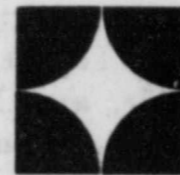
