Faith in the Fire

In the third chapter of the book of Daniel we read the story of the three Hebrew young men who chose the fiery furnace instead of compromising their convictions. Nebuchadnezzar, the king of Babylon, had set up a huge golden image for all his subjects to worship. Everyone was afraid to rebel against the king's commandment, so they bowed to the image. That is, everyone except the young Hebrews. They were captives of Nebuchadnezzar and yet they dared to defy his command because they believed in worshipping the true God only.

There are two striking things about Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego that Christians today need to have. One is: they believed that God was able to deliver them from the wrath of the king. They believed that if it pleased God, He could certainly stop the awful punishment which they were about to endure. But, secondly, if it was not His will to stop the torture, they were so resigned to will of God and obedience to right, that they would die in the burning furnace rather than sin against God. What a beautiful sight it must have been to God to see His children choose righteousness regardless of personal cost. That kind of faith and determination never escapes the eye of God.

The Hebrews were cast into the fire and the flames were so hot that the soldiers who cast them in were burned to death. But within that furnace of fire came a transformation. The scripture says that their clothing was not burned, their hair was not singed, and furthermore even the smell of fire was not about them. And best of all, the Son of God walked with them in the fire.

Christian, set your face like a flint for the heavenly city, and turn not aside from the path of righteousness. Then if you land in a fiery furnace of trial or trouble look around, the Son of God will be walking in the fire by your side!

News From Our County Agent

The rains this week have increased the danger of cotton insects says county agent H. M. Breedlove. Farmers are urged to keep a daily watch of their cotton fields and at the very first sign of insects to start spraying. Breedlove says that every day when the cotton is inspected to look around the shuck of the bolls for a small worm about the size of a hair. This is the boll worm and then is the time to spray before starts into the boll. When the boll worm gets in the boll then the poison will not reach him. Farmers in some parts of the county have already started a spray program and this is especially true in irrigated cotton. The boll worm has only made his appearance in a few fields so far, but a constant watch must be kept because the hatch and the damage can be done in a very short time.

The poisons being used are 2-1 mix of Toxaphene and DDT at the rate of two quarts per acre as a spray and 3-5 40 dust at the rate of about ten pounds per acre.

Anyone needing information should contact the county agent for help. Poison is available in the county and can be purchased at once.
