Work With a Song

Our generation has lost much of the sense of duty, joy, and satisfaction which comes from work—hard work. We have thought of shortening hours of labor and destroying the fruits of labor too much, so as to balance and economic theory. We have thought too much of the week ends off, the fishing trips, the vacations from labor as being the times when we really live. Work has been thought of as a curse or at best a necessary drudgery in order to live.

But Paul in his presentation of the lesson materials we use for Sunday's Sunday School lesson presents labor from an entirely different angle. He thought of work as a duty and something in which we may find deep satisfaction and pleasure. He endeavored to show that any work, however humble, is useful if the worker takes the right attitude toward it and if it is the kind of work that is helpful to others. Paul was a tentmaker and thus he glorified an humble task by his own example. To the followers of Christ at Thessalonica he wrote, "We exhort you brethren—to work with your hands." With similar admonition he wrote to the Christians of Colosse, "Whatever your task, work heartily, as serving the Lord and not men." The humblest task can be glorified if we see it in its proper perspective. We can see our children fed and educated from it. We can sing the song of the harvester.

Once there was a boy who loved music more than anything else in the world, but he had no ability to sing or play. All he could do was whittle. Unable to restrain his creative urge any longer he went to Amati, the violin maker in Cremona, and asked him if he would teach him to make violins. "Come into my house," said Amati, "and you shall try. The song in the heart is all that matters, for there are many ways of making music. Some play violins, some sing, some paint pictures, while others till the soil and grow flowers. Each sings a song and helps to make the music of the world; you can make music too."

The boy took hope from the old teacher and set about to learn to make violins. He put his heart into his work, whittling his hidden melody into the wood. His name was Antonio Stradivarius. He

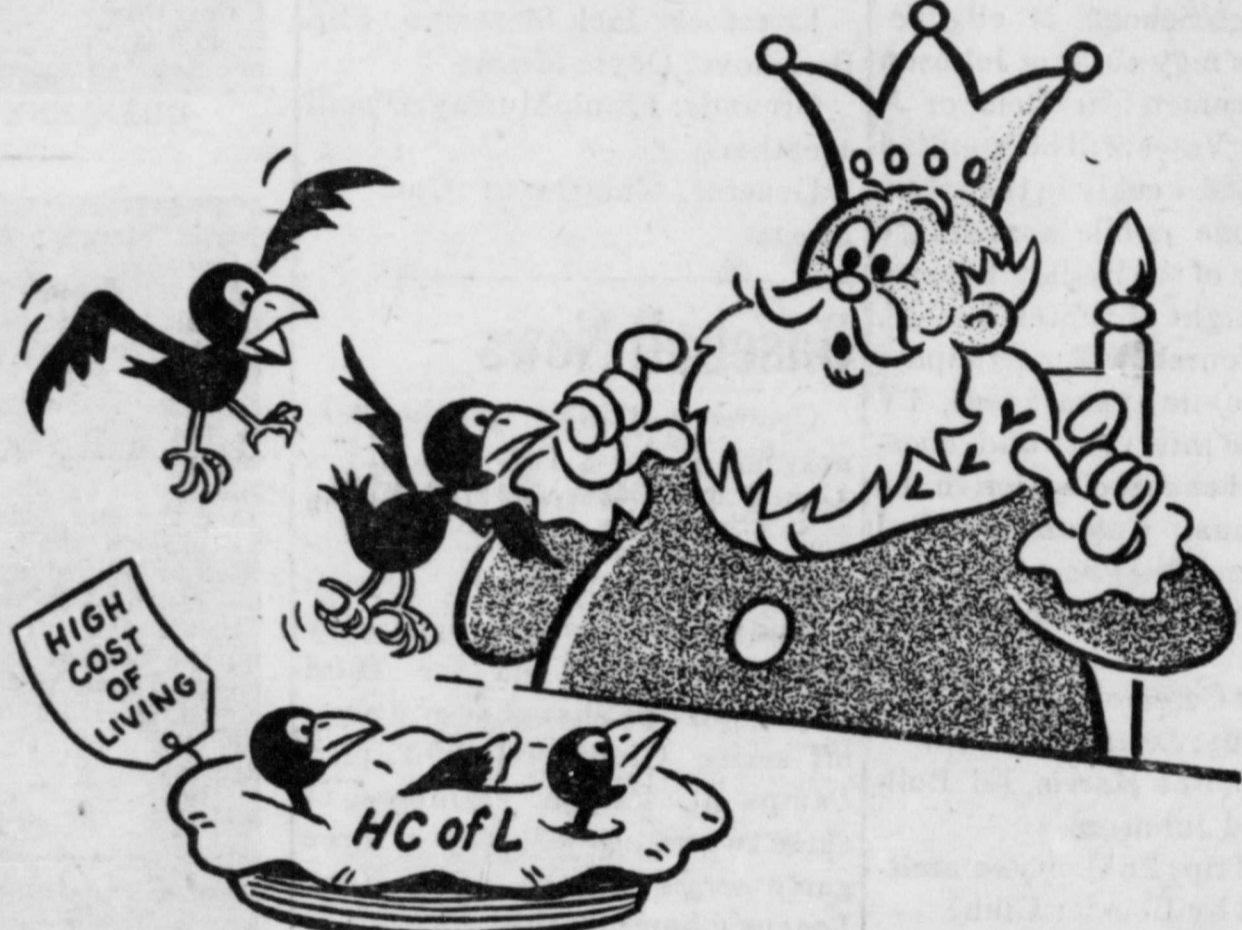

ALLAN SHIVERS

Governor Allan Shivers was re-nominated for a third term in last Saturday's second primary with a margin of about 92,000 votes over Ralph Yarborough. About 1,455,000 votes were cast, the highest ever recorded for a primary in Texas. This was the third time in Texas history when more votes were cast in the second primary than in the first. The vote in this primary exceeded the first by around 108,000.

In the Hedley box, 346 votes were cast, with 204 for Yarborough and 140 for Shivers.
