Funeral services for Mrs. Kate Ethel Lamberson, who passed away at Amarillo Sunday morning, were held Monday from the North Side Church of Christ there. Burial was in Rowe cemetery here.

Mrs. Lamberson was born in Hess, Okla., in 1891 and came to this area about 50 years ago. She was married to R. L. Lamberson about 1912, and they had lived here since that time until they moved to Amarillo about 8 years ago. Mr. Lamberson died in 1951.

Mrs. Lamberson had been a member of the Church of Christ since girlhood.

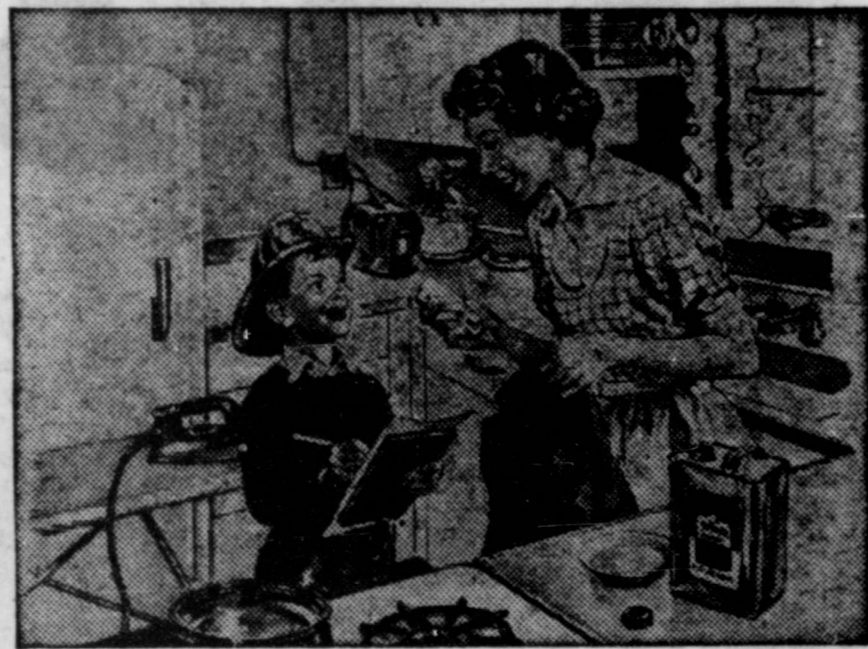

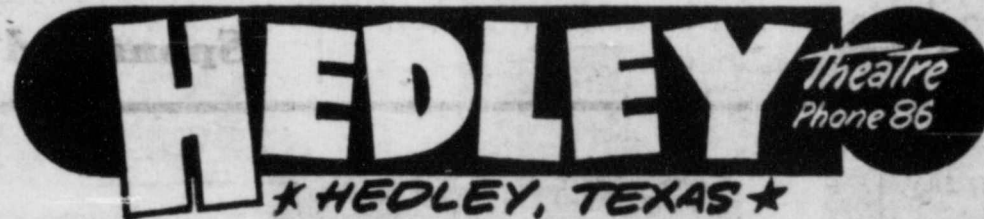

Cotton is coming in steadily now, and both Hedley gins are keeping busy.

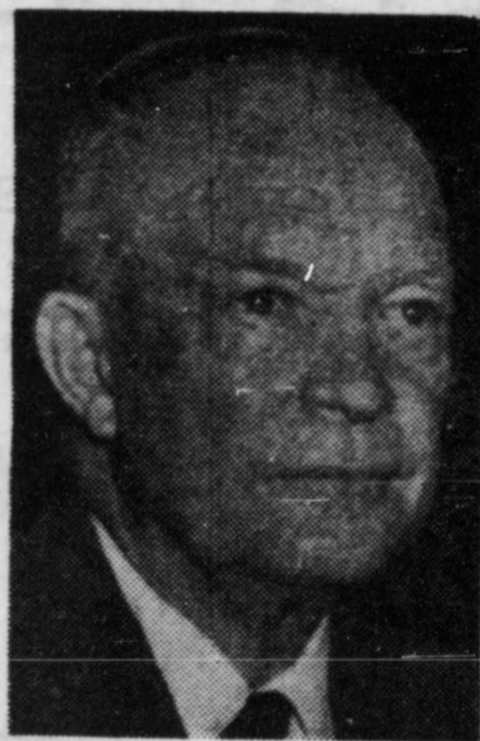
