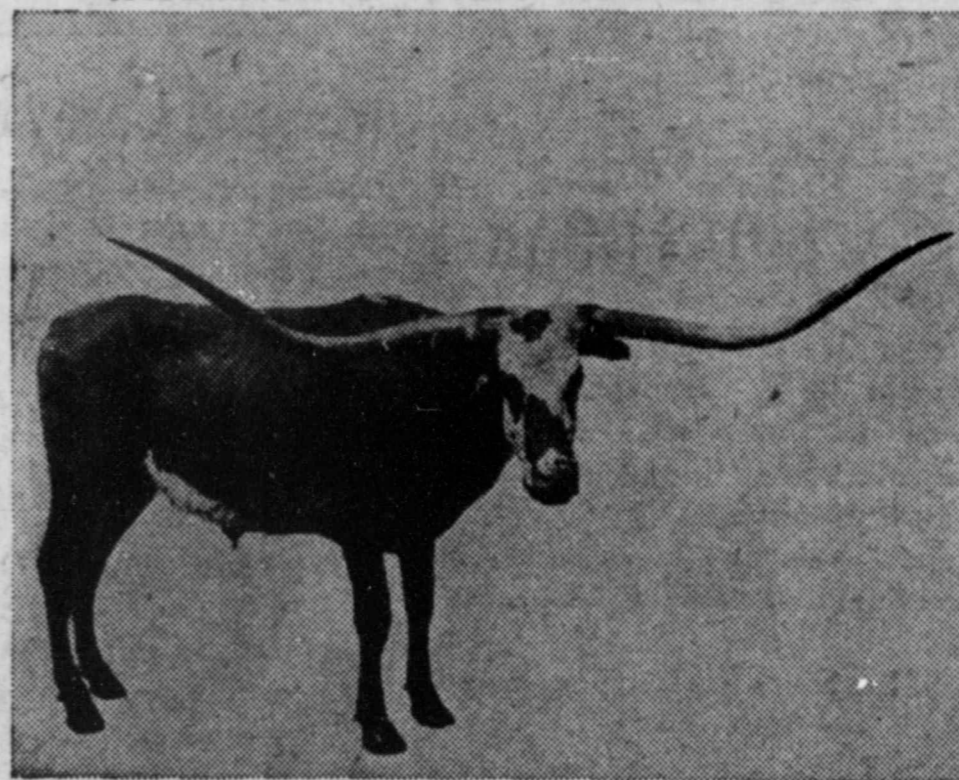

During the early decades of Anglo-American development of beef cattle industry, the concentration was heaviest on the Gulf Coastal Plain. At this time the Texas beef cow was the Longhorn type, derived largely from the early Spanish cattle, but with some of the blood of cattle introduced by the Anglo-American settlers. The cattle trail movement which began before the War Between the States was over the Chisholm, Dodge or Western, and other trails of that day. It has been estimated that some 11,000,000 cattle went up these old trails.

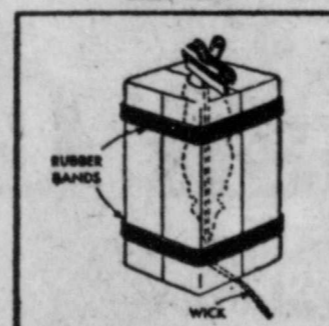

HOW TO CAST CHRISTMAS CANDLES



Handy Man Hint is condensed from one of Popular Mechanics' "DO-IT YOURSELF" books available at this store.

Christmas candles can be cast of your soap carvings. Place the carving in milk carton with one end cut out and pour plaster of paris to depth of an inch over model. After plaster mold hardens, tear away carton and saw mold in half. Remove soap carving and coat inside of mold with water glass mixed with an equal amount of water. When this has hardened, apply mineral oil to inner surfaces of mold. Assemble mold with rubber bands, inserting a heavy cord for wick, holding this centered with paper clamp. Pour in melted paraffin, let it harden, then gently remove mold.
