## News From Our County Agent

H. M. Breedlove, county agent, announced this morning that a request had gone from Donley County to the Governor of Texas, the Commissioner of Agriculture and the chairman of the drought relief committee for Donley County to be added to the drought relief counties for Texas Farmers, ranchers, and dairymen at a meeting in the conference room of the agent's office voted to make the request. The drought feed program this year, if approved for Donley, will be handled by the local Farmers Home Administration. Applications will be taken and the FHA committee will approve or disapprove them. Applications that are approved for drought aid will be sent to the local PMA office where a purchase order will be issued for the feed desired.

Types of feed to be bought under the program are corn, barley, oats, sweet feed, grain sorghum, and hay. One dollar per hundred was taken off the price for the grains above and one half the freight rate on baled hay. The program is for basic herds of breeding cattle and basic herds of dairy cattle.

The local FHA office will be notified when the request that Donley County be placed on the drought list is approved.
