Frank Kendall Tells Of California Trip

Editor Informer: You asked for a summary of our California trip which started on June 15. Mrs. Kendall and myself and Nancy Lou Hinds took the Santa Fe Chief Special at Amarillo at 10 o'clock and arrived in Oakland, Calif., at 1:30 the next day. Our son Chaplain Rex Kendall was waiting for us, and we went down to his home at Seaside, which is near Monterey. Camp Ord, where Rex is stationed, extends some five miles north and west and has some 40,000 soldiers in training at this time. During the next few days, we visited a number of the prominent places including Cannery Row and the fish wharves, went out in the glass bottom boat, watched the sun go down in the ocean from Sunset Point, and visited many other places. We visited the ancient town of Carmel, where the artists live and drove down the picturesque valley, where there is one of the oldest Catholic Cathedrals in California. We attended worship at the Post the first Sunday and heard Rex preach. He has number one Methodist Chapel, and there are some seven chapels within the post. Three are Methodist, and all other denominations are represented!

We drove to Redwood Park, which is up toward San Francisco, and spent Sunday evening. It causes a quiet reverence to steal over you when you stand in the presence of these giant trees that tower in the heavens and are reputed to be from two to four thousand years old. On our way back Sunday we came by Vera Cruz, where a great throng of people had gathered to crown Miss California.

At Watsonville, a few miles west of Monterey, is the artichoke center of the world, the only place in the United States where they grow. Old Monterey was one time the capital of California, and the old custom house still stands there at the port of entry. Here is where John Steinbeck got material for his latest novel, Cannery Row.

Time ran out, so we got busy for a reservation on the train and they were all taken for a week. We checked the airport, and found they had reservations. So on Wednesday morning, the 28th,
