Sgt. Bill B. Jenkins, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Jenkins of Hedley has been placed on temporary duty to participate in the National Air Show to be held in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th of September. Each year the Army, Air Force, Navy, and Marines take part in this show.

Sgt. Jenkins has been selected as one of 13 men from the Airborne Army Aviation Dept., The Infantry School, Ft. Benning, Ga., to participate in the Army phase of this demonstration.

The 13 men will make up a Pathfinder team. The purpose of the pathfinder team is to demonstrate to the civilian personnel the necessity of Army pathfinders setting up landing zones for helicopters in a joint Airborne, Army Aviation assault in a tactical simulated combat problem.
