Federal Land Bank Loan Limit Is Raised

Sterling C. Evans, President of The Federal Land Bank of Houston has advised the officers of The Donley County National Farm Loan Association that President Eisenhower has signed into law, a bill passed by Congress, raising to \$200,000.00 the Federal Loan available to one individual farmer or rancher.

Heretofore, loans to one owner have been limited to \$100,000.00, according to Rayburn L Smith, Secretary-Treasurer of the local Association. He feels that the needs of members can be better served in many cases by a larger loan.


