Funeral services for Benjamin Asbury James, 81 year old retired farmer, were conducted Tuesday in the First Baptist Church in Childress with the Rev. Ira L. Parrack and Dr. J. O. Haymes officiating. Burial was in the Childress Cemetery.

Mr. James, a long time resident of Childress County, died Sunday in the Childress General Hospital. A native of Alabama, he was born near Birmingham Sept 7, 1873. He had lived in Red River County prior to coming to Childress in 1914.

Elevator Ready

Work has been completed on the Kimbell Milling Co. elevator, and they are now ready to accept grain, local manager J. L. Chesser announced this week. This work has been in progress since July 9, they have used all local labor and bought all materials locally, and have had a payroll of over \$200 per week, Mr. Chesser stated.

The elevator has been completely rebuilt and its capacity doubled, making it now hold around 400,000 lbs. All new machinery has been installed. The new loader will load a box car every 40 minutes.

Mr. Chesser states that they have plenty of storage space for government loan grain at Fort Worth, and are prepared to store or buy, as the customer prefers. He will appreciate the patronage of all old and new friends.

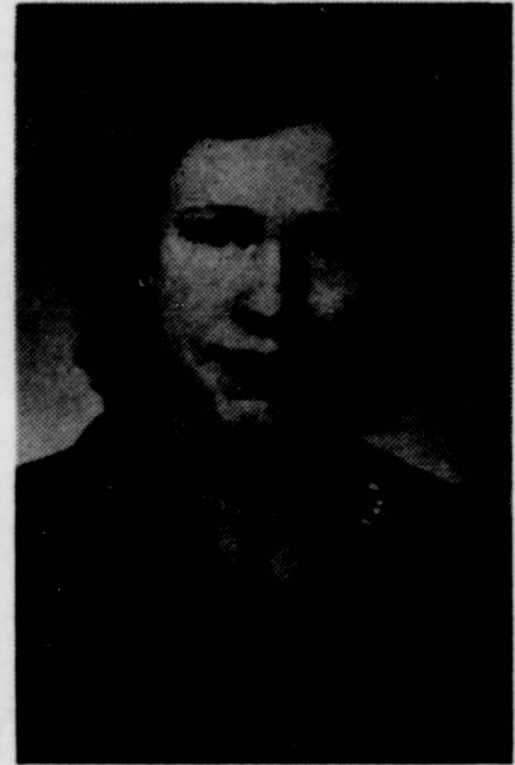
