The Scottish Rite Hospital has accepted almost 100,000 children for treatment since 1925. An expert staff, plus unique physical facilities and dedication to the welfare of the child, make it an outstanding treatment center which serves the entire state. It is supported by public contributions and bequests.

Highway Construction

A contract for new construction on U. S. Highway 66 in Gray and Donley Counties has been awarded to a Lubbock firm, it was announced in Austin this week by the State Highway Commission.

J. R. Fanning submitted the low bid of \$775,483.26 on the project. Construction of grading, structures, flexible base and asphaltic concrete pavement from near S. H. 70 west to Carson County line is expected to take 275 working days, according to James G. Lott, District Highway Engineer at Amarillo.

G. K. Reading, Resident Engineer at Pampa will be in active charge of the project while under construction.
