Boy Scout News

The Boy Scouts of Troop No. 36 have adopted the Troop Budget Plan and dues were set at 10¢ weekly. The dues will be collected at each Monday night meeting, and deposited in the troop treasure. The money will be spent during the registered Scout year as listed in our budget.

Insignias	.50
Troop supplies	.70

Reserve Fund	.25
Activities Fund	1.50
Total for each Scout	\$5.20

Dues develop in the Scout a sense of real responsibility to the life of the troop, thus providing an incentive to engage in systematic savings and stimulating regular payments of dues. The budget insures the prompt reregistration of the troop. When a boy first joins the troop he is required to pay his registration fee. The following year his registration fee is will be paid through the budget.

It makes Boys' Life available to every Scout at a special half price rate. It makes available to each Scout insignias of advancement, office, and membership. It provides for the purchase of troop supplies and upkeep of troop equipment, resulting in pride of ownership on the part of each Scout.

The good turn fund makes possible service to others in a material and encourages the spirit of sharing. The reserve fund takes care of unexpected expenses.

Scout tents and other equipment will be financed from money earning projects undertaken by the troop.

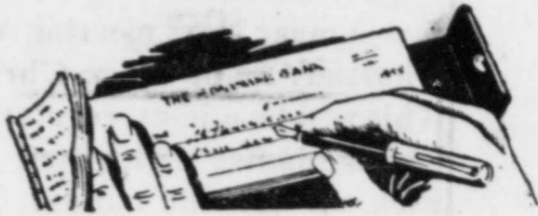

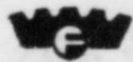

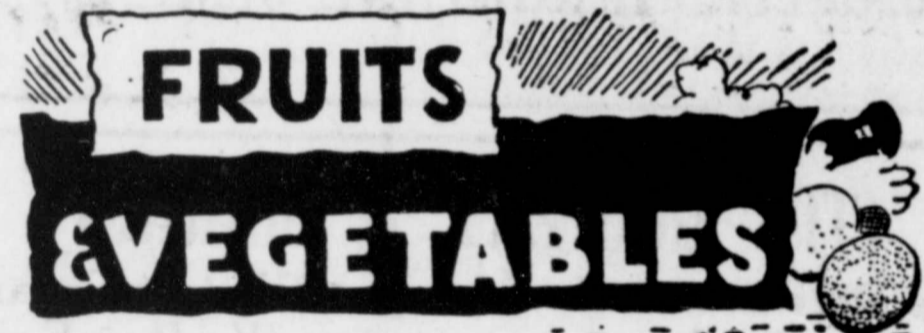
