To All Voters

There seems to be some confusion as to the requirements about voting. Every voter who was over the age of twenty-one, and under the age of sixty on the first day of January, 1955, must pay a poll tax in order to vote, unless he comes within some special exemption.

Your poll tax is not added or attached to your property tax, and therefore you may have paid your property tax and still not have paid your poll tax. Look through your tax papers and be sure that your poll tax receipt is dated before January 31, 1956. You cannot vote with a poll tax receipt issued after January 31, 1956.

In counties the size of Donley, all citizens who reached the age of sixty prior to January 1, 1955, may vote without a poll tax or certificate of any kind. Just go to the polls and vote.

Those who have or may reach the age of twenty-one after January 1, 1955, and before election day, may vote without paying a poll tax, provided they get a certificate of exemption from the tax collector prior to January 31, 1956. If you are one of this class who has just reached voting age, ask the tax collector for your certificate of exemption; you cannot vote without it.

Remember that your poll tax or your certificate of exemption is exactly like your property tax which is assessed as of January 1, 1955, and is payable on or before January 31, 1956. You will pay your poll tax according to your age and your property tax according to what you owned on January 1, 1955.

The Hedley Owls brought home the Consolation trophy from the Memphis tournament last week end, and the Owlets went to the finals on the Consolation side of the bracket before losing out.

Bill Reeves made the all tournament team.

The Owls lost their first game to Quail 41 to 51. Reeves led the scoring with 16 followed by Bailey with 13, McCarty 6, M. Owens 4, and Butler 2. In their second game the Owls downed Lakeview 59 to 45. Reeves pitched in 25

points, Butler and Woods 9 each, McCarty 8, Bailey 6, and M. Owens 2. The Owls only had 6 players at Memphis for this game. Three of these fouled off and in the last minute or so of play Hedley had only 3 players on the court. Their final game with Lelia Lake Saturday night was pretty close all the way through. The Owls were leading 54 to 51 when Lelia made 2 points in the last minute of play making the final score 54 to 53. Bailey led the scoring with 21, followed by Reeves 15, M. Owens 12, McCarty 4, Woods and Butler 1 each.

The Owlets opened against the tough Memphis team losing 35 to 52. Judy Wynn won top scoring honors with 15, Sanders made 10, Hunsucker 8, and Houdashell 2. The guards were Sanders, Sims, McKee, Hinds, and Sandra and

Linda Davis. Coach Martin said the girls played their best game of the season against Lelia Lake to win their second game. The final score was 63 to 46. 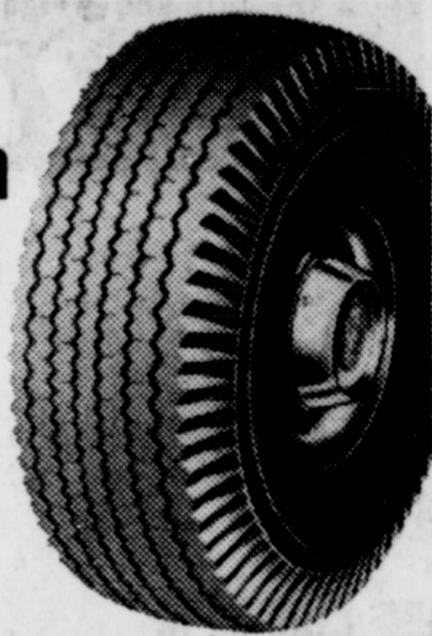

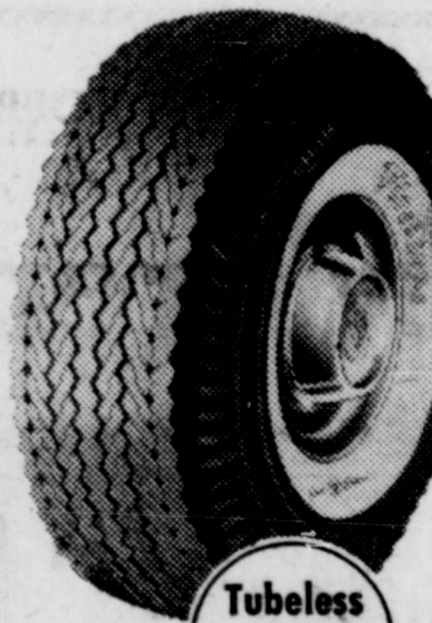
