Questions and Answers On Salt Fork Dam

In the near future a confirmation election will be held in the seven area towns concerned to approve or reject the Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority, which proposes the dam across Salt Fork of Red River north of Hedley. The Informer is publishing a series of articles in question and answer form to acquaint the voters with the facts concerning this project.

(Continued from last week)

Q: Were the water rights secured from the State Board of Water Engineers?

A: Yes, these water rights were granted by the State Board of Water Engineers under the condition that the program would show definite progress of development before January 1, 1955.

Q: What location for the proposed dam has been selected?

A: The dam location, subject to engineering review, has been tentatively established just below the junction where Whitefish Creek flows into the Salt Fork of Red River. This is in east edge of Donley County, about 8 miles north of Hedley.

Q: How much water will be the capacity of the proposed lake?

A: The lake will have a capacity of 100,000 acre feet with a depth at the dam of about 60 feet. The lake will have a drainage area of 750 square miles, or about 5-6 the size of the average county in the Panhandle.

Q: How many gallons are in an acre foot of water?

A: There are 325,829 gallons in an acre foot of water.

Q: What will be the approximate size of the proposed lake?

A: Present plans indicate the lake will be in an elbow shape with about 5 miles north to south and about 5 miles east to west.

Q: How can this be compared to some other water supply lakes which might be familiar to people of Western Texas?

A: The most likely comparison would be Lake Worth at Fort Worth. Lake Worth has a capacity of 24,000 acre feet of water. This proposed lake with 100,000 acre feet of water would be four times as large.

Q: What do the engineers estimate will be year-round average availability of water which can

Election May 8

We are informed that an election will be held on May 8 to confirm the legal organization of the Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority.

This election will not vote any bonds, but is merely to confirm Hedley as a member of the group of towns participating.

City Election

There will be a city election on April 3 to elect a mayor and three aldermen for the city of Hedley.

Names of all candidates must be filed with the city secretary not later than March 3.

be obtained for the members of this Authority?

A: 25 million gallons daily.

Q: What is the approximate daily consumption of the towns proposed to be included in the Authority?

A: Based upon the towns of Clarendon, Hedley, Memphis, Wellington, Childress, Paducah, Quanah, Shamrock and McLean, with an estimated total population of 32,843 and an average usage of 100 gallons per capita, gives an average combined daily consumption of 3,284,300 gallons, which is about 13% of the available supply.

Q: What engineers have been employed by the Authority to make the plans and direct the development of the project?

A: The Authority has selected a firm of Water Engineers who are well known in West Texas Water problems and whose reports are recognized by Investors in Securities of this type. Freese and Nichols of Fort Worth are the engineers. They are quite familiar with water problems in all of Western Texas.

Q: What is the quality of water to be obtained?

A: Chemical analysis has been made by the Quality of Water Division of the U. S. Geological Survey. Reports on flood flows of the water show good quality; low flows not quite as good as desired but on the whole it is considered that water from this reservoir will be of better quality than required by standards of Health Department. Other tests for full determination of quality of the water will be made to be sure that it is fully desirable.

To City Taxpayers

All unpaid City taxes became delinquent on Feb. 1st. The City of Hedley follows the law governing delinquent county taxes, as set forth in Article 7336, Vernon's Texas Statutes, and which adds a penalty each month until it reaches 8% within six months, and which also adds interest at the rate of 1/2% per month, or 6% per year.

Thus a taxpayer who is delinquent one year owes the full amount plus 14%, one who is delinquent two years owes the full amount plus 20%, etc.

To encourage getting rid of these delinquents, the City of Hedley has decided to allow payment of these taxes without penalty and interest until March 1st.

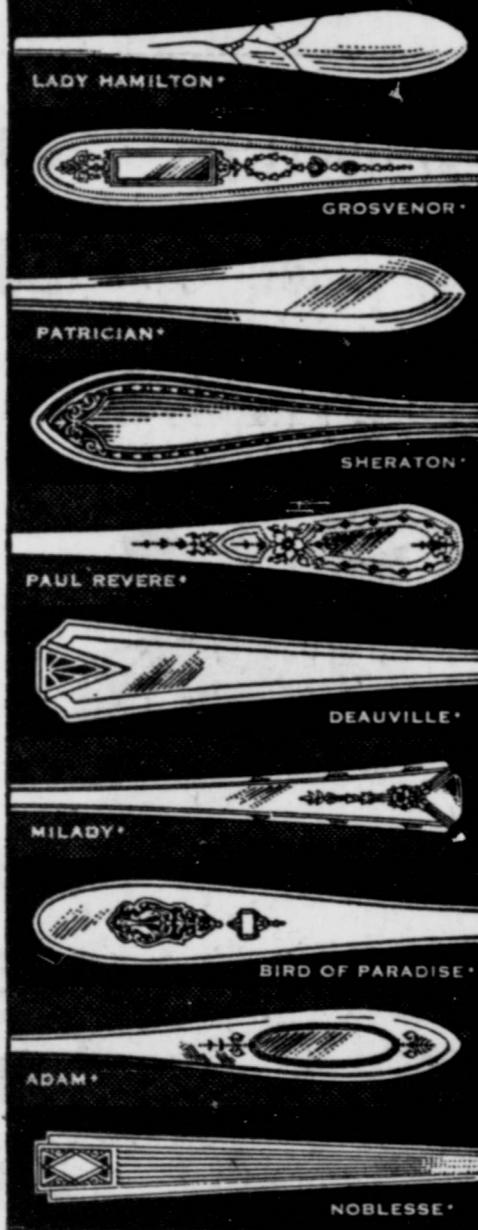
