Q: Will it be possible to lower this charge of 25¢ per thousand From Sheriff's Race gallons when any city uses more water than called for in its minimum purchase contracts?

A: Yes. This price will be flexible and subject to reduction as in creased water sales are made. As an example, if a contract with a city is made whereby the Authority agrees to sell and the City agrees to purchase a minimum of 500,000 gallons of water daily, the dollar price accruing from this contract at 25¢ per thousand gallons will be \$125.00 daily. This becomes a fixed requirement which can be reduced when the income from the over-all sale of water by the Authority becomes sufficient that the price can be lowered by the Board of Directors. 


