



The dreaded pink boffworm is moving into cotton fields in all areas of Texas. When the cotton plants first start blooming, fields should be checked between 9:00 A.M. and Noon, daily, for about ten days for rosetted blooms. Rosetted cotton blooms

indicate the presence of pink bollworm. The worm can be found by tearing open a rosetted bloom. Farmers should be on the lookout for pink bollworms, and are urged to contact their County Agent for control recommendations.
