Clarendon To Hold Annual Celebration

Clarendon's annual 4th of July Celebration will begin Monday, July 2, at 8 p. m. with a rodeo at the Rodeo Arena. Performances will also be held at 8 p. m. on the 3rd and at 2 p. m. and 8 p. m. on the 4th.

On the 4th a big free barbecue will be served at the Court House square at 11:30 a. m. to be followed by a big parade. Over four thousand pounds of beef will be barbecued with County Agent H. M. Breedlove in charge. There will be twelve serving lines with two additional serving lines for colored people. All of the meat and food to be served was donated by ranchers, merchants and individuals from Clarendon and other parts of the county.
