## Primary Election

Hedleyans took an interest in last Saturday's primary election, 401 votes being cast here.

For Sheriff in the local box Truett Behrens got 180 votes, Lois Putman 113 and Bill Cornell 99. In the county the vote was Behrens 757, Cornell 681 and Putman 516.

For District Attorney Hedley gave Allen Harp 139, John T. Forbis 128 and Paul Spillman 106. The district total was Harp 3915, Forbis 3757 and Spillman 2087.

For County Attorney Hedley voted Bill Lowe 288 and R. Y. King 107. The county vote was Lowe 1207, King 702.

For Representative Hedley went 256 for Will Ehrle to 109 for Elbert Reeves. Ehrle was elected, but we were unable to secure the official totals.

Congressman Walter Rogers, District Judge Luther Gribble, County Supt. Ruth Richerson, Commissioner F. M. Murray and Precinct Chairman R. W. Scales were elected without opposition.

In the local races, this leaves Truett Behrens and Bill Cornell in a runoff for Sheriff and Allen Harp and John T. Forbis in a runoff for District Attorney.

In the state races, Hedley gave W. Lee O'Daniel 172 votes for Governor, Ralph Yarborough 78, Price Daniel 76, J. Evetts Haley 56 and Reuben Senterfitt 3.

For Lieutenant Governor John Lee Smith got 176, Ben Ramsey 97, A. M. Aikin Jr. 49 and C. T. Johnson 15.

For Attorney General this box gave Will Wilson 130, Tom Moore 96, Ross Carlton 40 and Curtis E. Hill 26.

All three referendum questions carried by a big margin.


