Greenbelt Dam

More interest is being shown in the dam lately, probably on account of the dry weather and water shortage in many parts of the state. The Association Directors have about decided to give the original towns a last chance to get in the water district, and if they don't decide to come in to reduce the project and take in just the interested cities.

Daily samples of the water are being taken and tested of the regular flow of water, and two extra samples were taken this month to get a test when the water was at higher levels. Also the flow of water is being gaged at intervals and after each rise in the river. So far, no bad reports have come from the tests.
