J. R. Bulls Dies

Funeral services for James Robert Bulls of Clarendon, who passed away Saturday, were held Monday from the First Methodist Church there by Rev. Conrad N. Ryan and Dr. E. D. Landreth. Burial was in the Clarendon cemetery.

Mr. Bulls was born Nov. 1, 1878 in Lauderdale County, Alabama, and had lived in Clarendon since 1919. He served as a county commissioner for eight years and was a city judge several years. He had been a steward in the Methodist Church for over fifty years.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Grace M. Bulls; two daughters, Mrs. Ross Adamson of Ropesville and Mrs. H. H. Hahn of Pampa; three sons, B. F. of Kermit, Woodrow of Odessa and Roy of Amarillo; one sister, Mrs. Lelia Baldrige of Levelland; one brother, John W. Bulls of Mangum, Okla.; and seven grandchildren.

Interest Shown in Second Primary

Hedleyans took about as much interest in the second primary Saturday as in the first, 399 votes being cast Saturday compared to 401 in July.

For Sheriff, Hedley gave Bill Cornell 205 votes and Truett Behrens 191, for District Attorney John T. Forbis received 216 and Allen Harp 174, for Attorney General Will Wilson got 226 and Tom Moore 136, for Governor Ralph Yarborough 270 and Price Daniel 119.

The unofficial county total gave Bill Cornell 1019 and Truett Behrens 828. Over the district, John T. Forbis received 5,164 votes and Allen Harp 4,664.

Highway Patrol Active in July

In carrying out their basic duties of traffic law enforcement, the 33 highway patrolmen of the Amarillo district during the month of July investigated 110 traffic accidents. During the period 810 traffic arrests were made, 414 for speeding and 26 for driving while intoxicated, and 1996 warnings were given.

In these accidents 8 persons were killed, 75 were injured and property damage was estimated at \$55,903.00.

During the same month last year 11 were killed and 84 injured, with property damage of \$69,204.

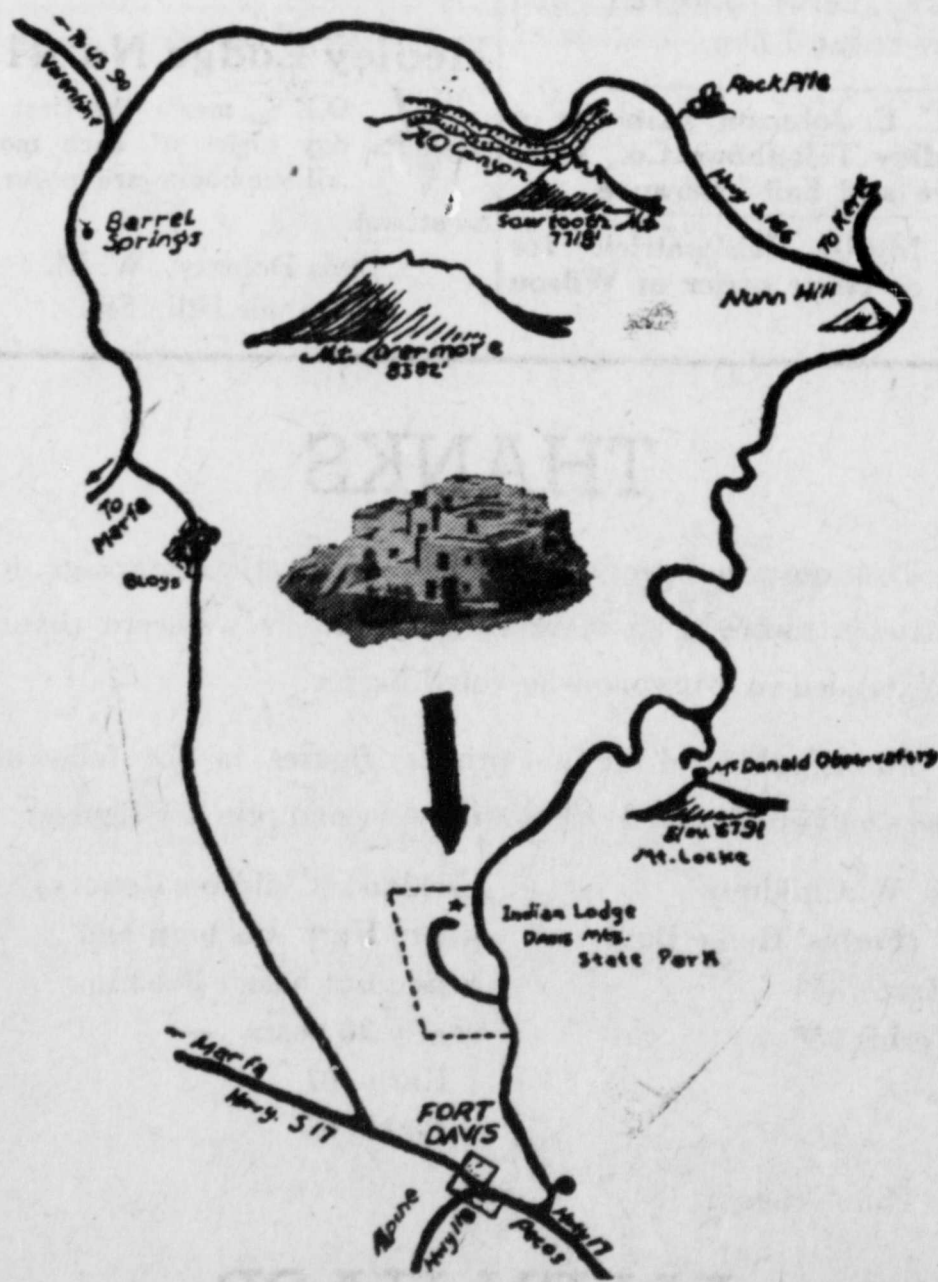

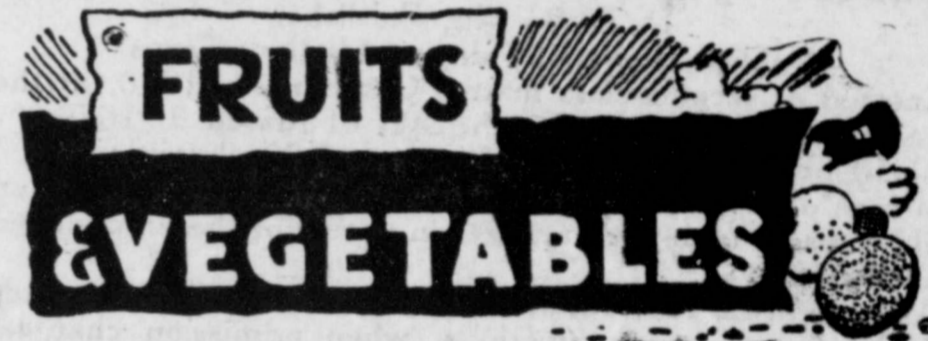
