News From Our County Agent

Donley County 4-HClub steers will start leaving for the Amarillo show on Thursday afternoon, says County Agent H. M. Breedlove. Fifteen steers will be shown by the 4-H Club members, some are being kept at home to put on more weight for the Houston show in February. The judging at the Amarillo show will start at 9 A. M. on Monday, Jan. 21. The show will end on Friday the 25th with a big sale. Some of the Donley steers will sell but a number will be brought home to go on to the Houston show.


Mr. Barker was born in Johnson County Oct. 24, 1872, and came to Donley County in 1906.






