Fat Stock Show

The lamb and pig portion of the Donley County Fat Stock Show will be held Friday at Clarendon. A good number of Hedley entries is expected. The animals will be taken on to Amarillo on Saturday for the Amarillo show. Animals will be sifted on Sunday and judged on Monday. The sale will take place on the following Friday.

About 12 to 15 Hedley entries are expected for this show.

News From Our County Agent

Donley County 4-H Club steers will start leaving for the Amarillo show on Thursday afternoon, says County Agent H. M. Breedlove. Fifteen steers will be shown by the 4-H Club members, some are being kept at home to put on more weight for the Houston show in February. The judging at the Amarillo show will start at 9 A. M. on Monday, Jan. 21. The show will end on Friday the 25th with a big sale. Some of the Donley steers will sell but a number will be brought home to go on to the Houston show.

4-H Club members will eat and sleep in the big 4-H Club bus but more space will be needed so Hershel Heath, owner of the A A A Motor Co., is letting the 4-H Clubbers use his bus in addition to the present bus to accommodate all of the members showing steers. This will eliminate all expense for sleeping quarters and meals will come cheap with their own meals being cooked on the bus. Breedlove says that Mr. Heath has been a big help to the 4-H Club members in helping to fix up their bus and now he is lending his bus to help take care of all making the trip. There will be a few members who will stay with relatives in Amarillo, but all who had to pay room rent will be housed in the busses. Everyone is urged to come by and see the busses and there might be a cup of hot coffee on hand.

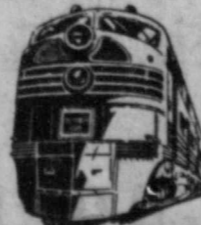

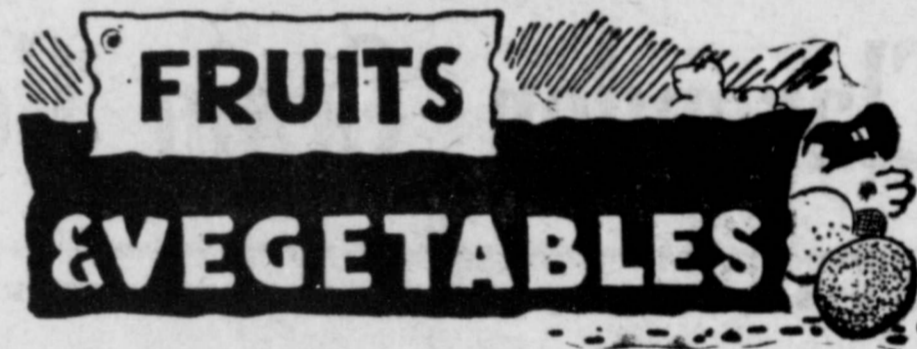
