All speakers are specialists in their respective fields and Breedlove urges everyone to attend for some first hand information on subjects that are important to farmers and ranchers in this section of the state. The program will be as follows:

10 to 10:30 A. M., Emmett Dignan, who will discuss finances in regard to cattle and farming.

10:30 to 11 A. M., Bob Cherry will discuss farming under the Soil Bank.

11 to 12, Jack King will discuss Hybrid Grain Sorghums and new crops.

1 to 2 P. M., Tom Prater will discuss the economics of irrigation. 2 to 3 P. M., Paul Marion will discuss livestock feeding practices. 3 to 4 P. M., John McHaney will discuss farming and ranching outlook for 1957.


