## Boy Scout News

Friday evening six members of Troop No. 36 went on an overnight camping trip out to the A. G. Alexander farm south of Hedley. They arrived at their camp site about 6:30 p. m.

The first thing that took place was fire building so that everyone could warm up. (The temperature was about 15 degrees Friday night.) By the light of the camp fire and a lantern the Scouts put up their tent and fixed their bed rolls in place. Supper was then cooked and eaten. After everyone sat around the camp fire and talked about the weather and methods to camp, the Scouts went to bed about 9 p. m. In order to keep their water supply from freezing, the Scouts placed the three one gallon jugs of water around in various parts of the tent. When the Scouts got up on Saturday at 7:30 a. m. the jugs had a little ice in them. After everyone left the tent and built up the camp fire, one of the Scouts brought the water out by the fire, by this time one of the jugs had almost frozen solid and the other two were getting mushy.

A hot breakfast of pancakes and hot chocolate was prepared by Scoutmaster Boaz Stotts assisted by Joe Darnell. After breakfast the Scouts went on a treasure hunt. The treasure was located in some grass about 100 yards from camp. Each Scout received a one pound can of Golden Crumble candy.

A hike down the creek to a small spring then took place, to see the wonders of Mother Nature in the winter time. The spring was all frozen over and the water that had rippled down the creek bed had frozen over, forming some small water falls and icicles and other odd and curious shapes. The Scouts returned to camp after hiking about half a mile down the creek. By this time the cedar trees and ground had a light coat of sleet and snow.

After warming up by the fire and drinking hot chocolate the Scouts broke camp and returned home about 1:30 p. m. This was the first all weather camp and hike for Troop No. 36.

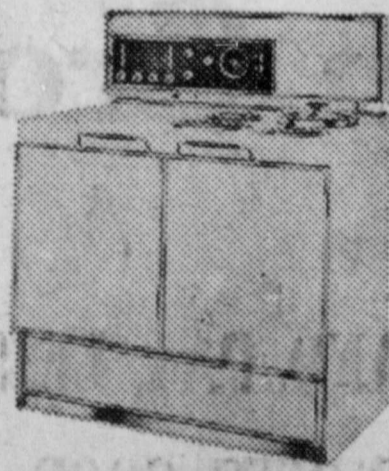


