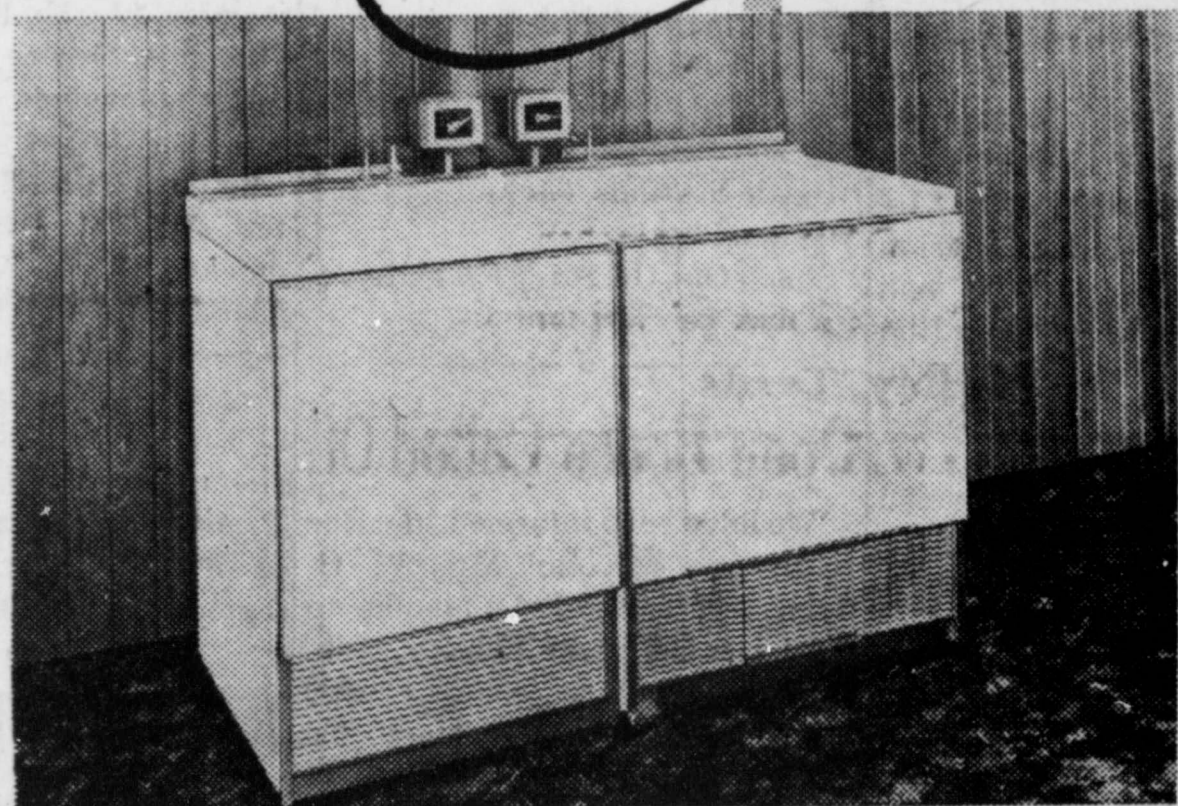

As quickly as one bill is passed or defeated, there will be two to take its place. Last session a total of 1500 bills were introduced before the House.

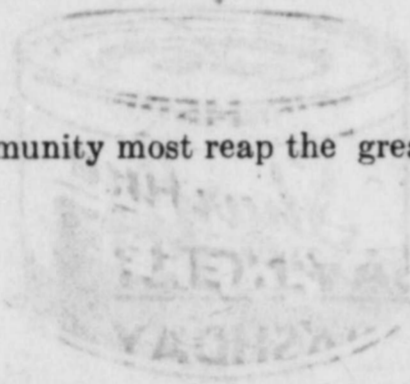

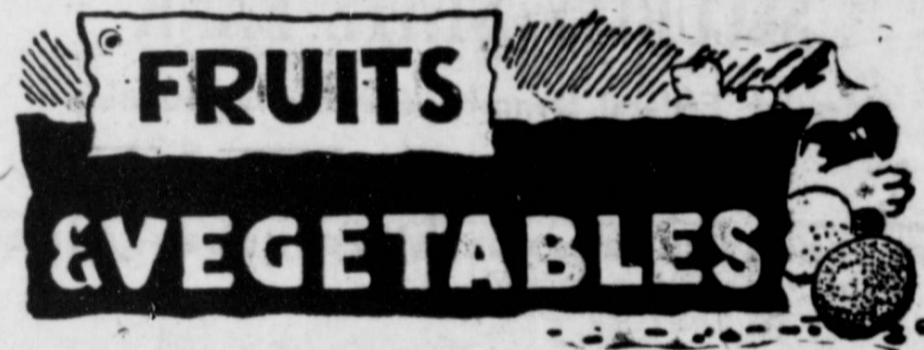
