Discussion Group

In the final of his four informative and meaning-packed articles on the U S S R, A P analyst William L. Ryan makes the statement that the Russian people "are weary of lectures and strictures, of being told 'it is necessary—you must do this—you must think that—' They, being normal human beings, like to think things out for themselves, to get together in discussions free from the fear of "thought control." It is also noted that the "new Soviet man," having received better schooling than his father, does not as readily yield blind obedience. We in America today take this freedom for granted. Many think they have done their duty when they vote, but of what value is an ignorant vote? What does it profit society if all of our opinions on public issues are readily aired, if they are based on closed minds instead of mature reflection? There is no such thing as an ignorant democracy. Men vote their feelings, and these feelings are compounded of emotions and reason. The latter element ought to be a great part of any man's vote.

It is informative to realize that one-party states helped to ruin Italy, Germany, the U S S R, and Japan, and that the lack of a strong two party system keeps France in turmoil. The interdependence of our economy, both nationally and world wide, is apparent to all observant people. Just how far small nations can trust our foreign policy is quite a question just now. Our discussion group is said to be "Devoted to a Study of Current Events in Depth," that is, realizing that profound problems call for profound thought, with subsequent action absolutely consistent with what history, geography, literature, biography, and the moral sense of mankind tell us about behavior as related to our scientific age. For reasonable people, no public issue is too hot to handle.

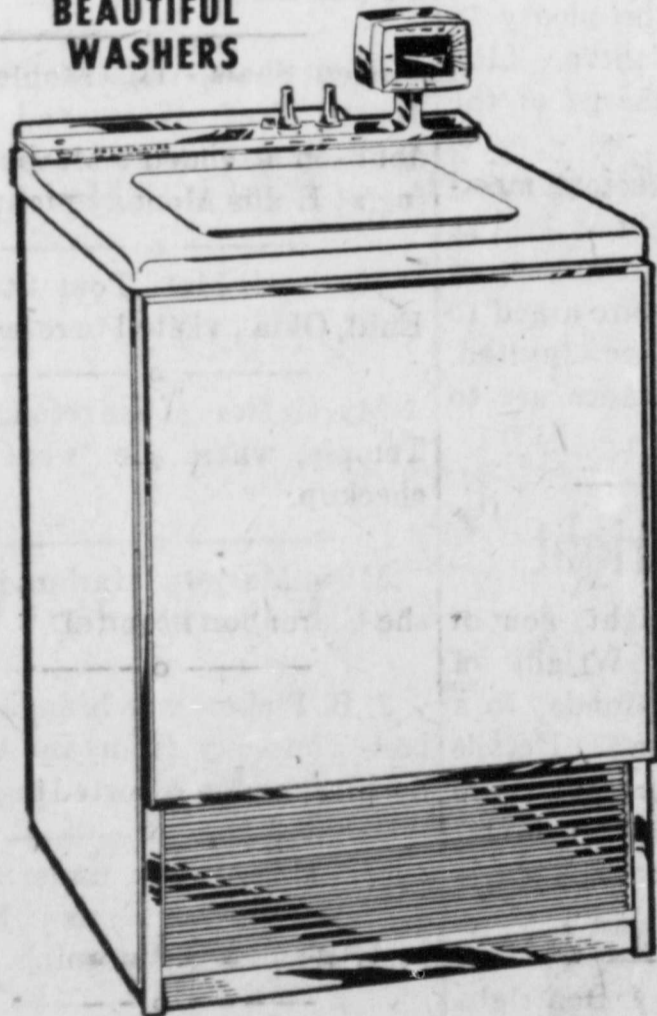
