Funeral services for Horace A. Leggitt of Memphis, who passed away in a hospital there Wednesday of last week after a lengthy illness, were held Thursday from the First Methodist Church at Memphis by Rev. David W. Binkley. Burial was in the Lakeview cemetery with Spicer Funeral Home in charge.

Mr. Leggitt was born Nov. 5, 1892 in Ennis, and moved to Hall County with his parents in 1907. He was united in marriage to Miss Ruby Bevers on Feb. 13, 1930 at Mountain Park, Okla., and had lived since that time at Lakeview, Turkey and Memphis. He was a veteran of World War I, a member of the American Legion and the Methodist Church.
