## FFA News

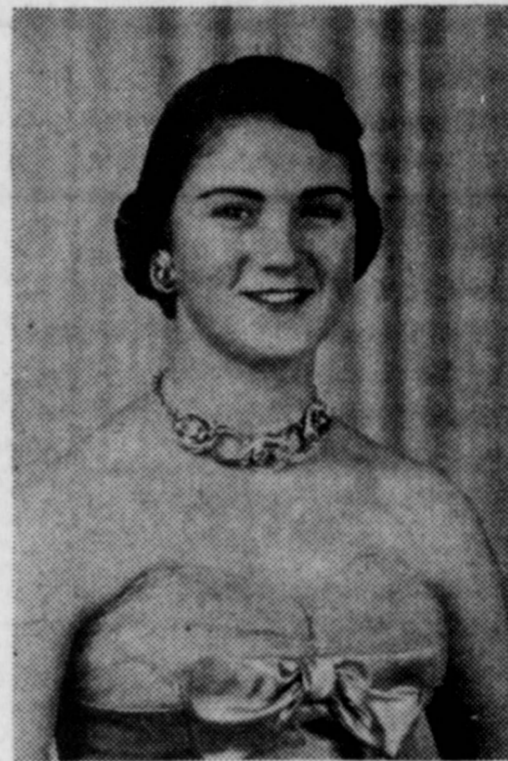


**Methodist Church**

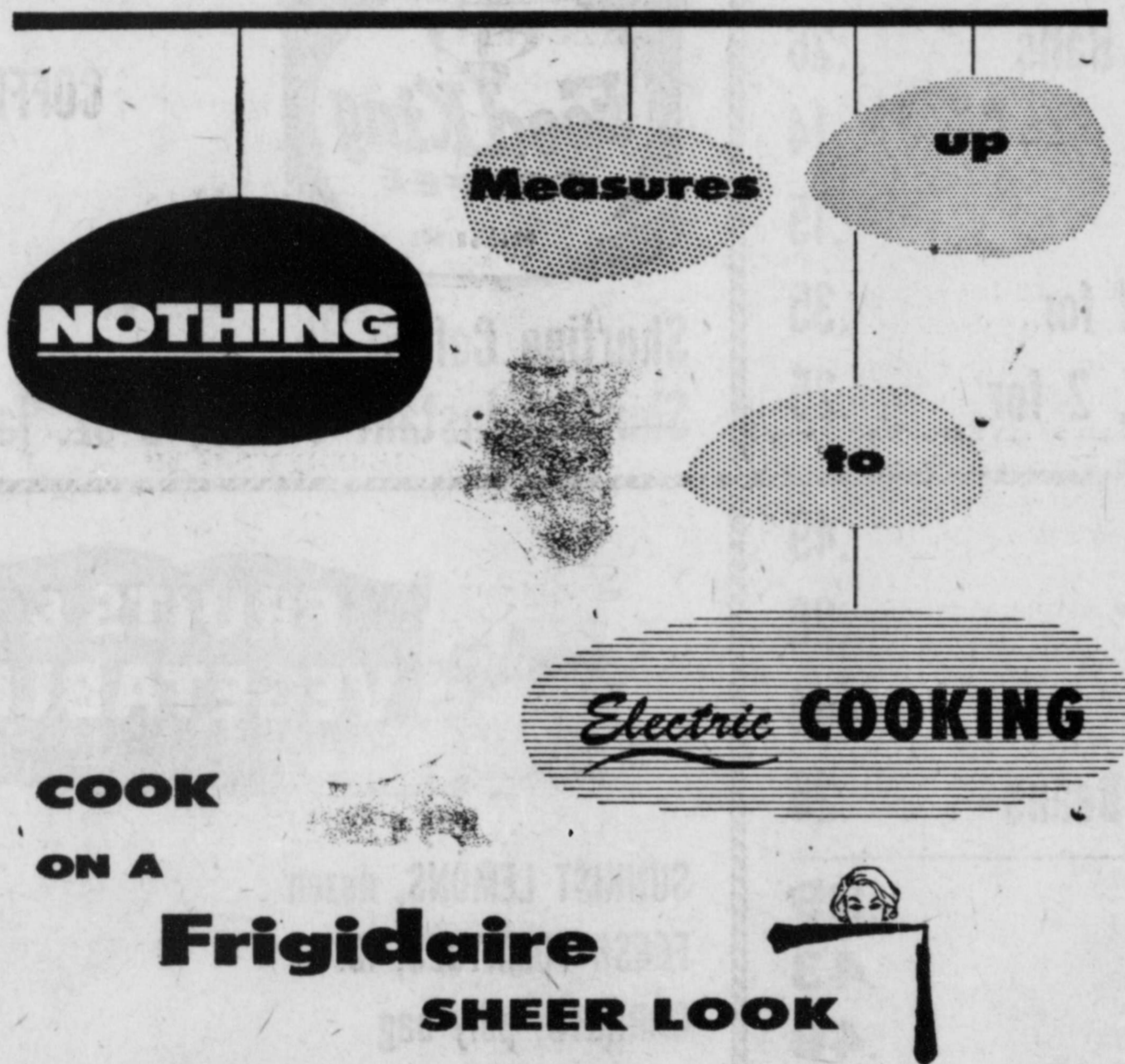

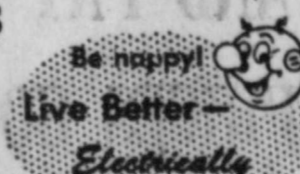
