In carrying out their basic duties of traffic law enforcement the 42 Patrolmen of the Amarillo District No. 5B, composed of 31 counties, investigated 165 traffic accidents during September They made a total of 1167 traffic arrests, of which 639 were speeding arrests, and also issued 3496 warnings for hazardous violations.

In these aecidents, 12 persons were killed, 119 were injured, and property damage was \$156,738 In the first 9 months of this year 80 were killed and 652 injured in this district.
