## Cotton Festival

The cold drizzle Friday cut down on the crowd attending the sixth Hedley Cotton Festival. Four bands were forced to cancel their coming due to flu. Many events were eliminated or postponed, but nevertheless the Festival was a great success.

Queen Mary Baker was crowned on Thursday night, then on Friday Senator Ralph Yarborough, Congressman Walter Rogers, State Senator Andy Rogers and Representative Will Ehrle all addressed the crowd. The Frank Claborne group from Shamrock, the Clarendon Junior College group and the McLean band performed, and the style show and old fiddlers contest were held as scheduled. Richard Stotts won first, Eck Robertson second, and Walter Johnson third in the fiddlers contest.

On Saturday the weather was much better. Paul Spillman addressed the crowd, the Quail high school chorus and the Khiva Temple Drum and Bugle Corps performed, the kids parade was held at 12:30 and the grand parade at 1:30. Float awards went to Dorothy's Beauty Shop first, Sodalitas Club second and Moffitt Hardware third. Blue ribbons and cash awards went to the Clarendon high school band, the Clarendon north ward and the Khiva Temple.

The crowd also enjoyed the Maverick Club, the rodeo, the cake walk, turtle races, guinea races, etc.

## Highway Patrol Active

In carrying out their basic duties of traffic law enforcement the 42 Patrolmen of the Amarillo District No. 5B, composed of 31 counties, investigated 165 traffic accidents during September. They made a total of 1167 traffic arrests, of which 639 were speeding arrests, and also issued 3496 warnings for hazardous violations.

In these accidents, 12 persons were killed, 119 were injured, and property damage was \$156,738. In the first 9 months of this year 80 were killed and 652 injured in this district.
