Due to a flood of requests (well, 8 or 10), asking for another personal column, here it is:

The Informer family spent last week end in Crystal City visiting with Mrs. Myrtle Tinsley and Mrs. Doris Shaw. We found another town which, like Hedley, was observing its 50th anniversary. The local newspaper, the Zavala County Sentinel, issued a special edition last week giving a nice account of the town's history. Crystal City has a good location in the area known as the Winter Garden, has a population now estimated at over 10,000, and is widely known as a spinach center, having a statue of Popeye on the main thoroughfare. One amusing note in the Sentinel's edition mentioned that about 40 years ago their electric lights were turned off at 11 p. m., and for some reason the lights became very weak. Investigation showed that a citizen was using an electric heating pad to warm his cold feet, which lost him his standing in the community in a hurry.

Another feature of the landscape around Crystal City is Espantosa Lake, which means haunted or terrifying lake. The legend goes that the settlers of the lost Del Rio colony, who established a settlement in the area in 1834, were killed by Indians and their bodies thrown into the lake. You can find another legend about Espantosa Lake in J. Frank Dobie's book, Coronado's Children.

News From Our County Agent

County agent H. M. Breedlove has announced that plans are under way for a big agriculture clinic to be held in Donley County next February. The clinic this year will be a two day affair with one day in Clarendon and one day in Hedley. An all day agriculture meeting has been held in Clarendon for the past four years during the month of February, however Breedlove thinks that a two day meeting will get in touch with more people.

The topics that will be talked on this year will be irrigation, insect control, plant disease, cotton, wheat, and grain sorghum and all types of livestock. The different topics will be discussed by specialist from the Texas A&M College Extension Service. Plans are also to devote some time in each meeting on the High Plains Conservation Program which is just now getting started in this area. Breedlove says as plans develop and the definite program is worked out, it will be published in the local papers and on radio.

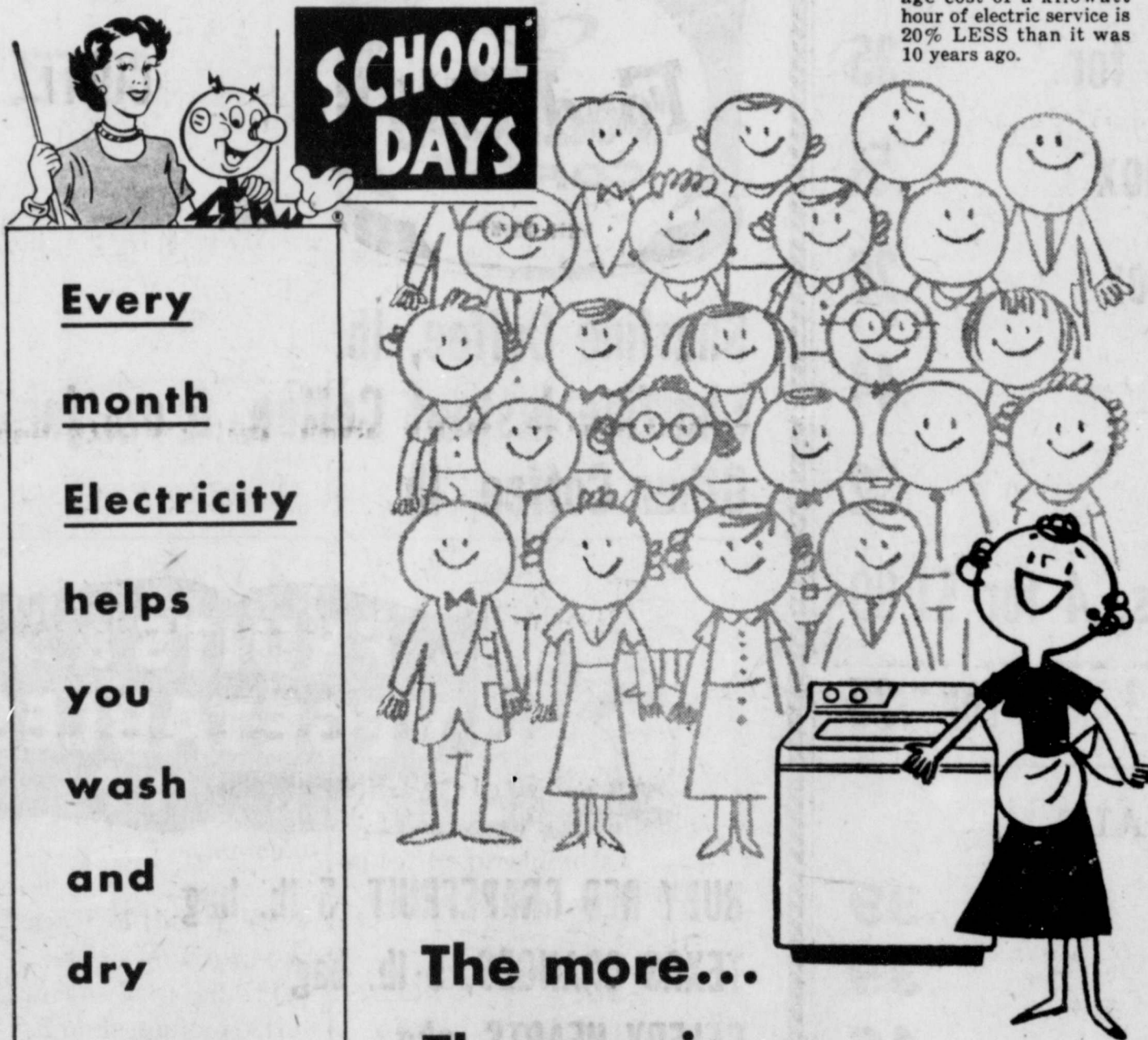
